Father Julian

Hello and happy Sunday!

I hope everyone has been enjoying the final weeks of our fall season. This is my favorite time of the year, even if we are already getting snow! Every time the leaves change and the pumpkins begin to make their way to the front stoop, I am always reminded of God's bountiful gifts. The bright colors show God's handiwork in his creation and just how much of an artist he truly is. How amazing it is to know that the Lord has not only cared for our needs in the riches of the harvest, but He has also made it beautiful.

This week we are reminded of the true gift of the saints; those men and women who have lived their lives for Christ and continue to be a witness of love virtue for us today. As we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints, we recall not only our own personal devotions to our patron saints, but every saint that lives with God in Heaven. A few weeks ago, I had the opportunity to teach our School kids about the process of canonization, speaking specifically about our own Br. Casimir Michael Cypher whose cause for sainthood is still ongoing.

In official Church procedures there are three steps to sainthood: a candidate becomes "Venerable," then "Blessed" and then "Saint." Venerable is the title given to a deceased person recognized formally by the Pope as having lived a heroically virtuous life or offered their life. To be beatified and recognized as a Blessed, one miracle acquired through the candidate's intercession is required in addition to recognition of heroic virtue or offering of life. Canonization requires a second miracle after beatification. The pope may waive these requirements. A miracle is not required prior to a martyr's beatification, but one is required before canonization.

Each of us is called to sanctity and to a life of holiness and virtue. This is also referred to as the "Universal Call to Holiness" by the Second Vatican Council. St. Paul tells us to live so "as becomes saints" and to put on "as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved a heart of mercy, kindness, humility, meekness, patience," and to possess the fruit of the Spirit in holiness." (Gal. 5:22, Rom. 6:22) These are all great virtues that we can strive to live out in our Christian lives of discipleship, and by witnessing to these habits of life, we too have the great opportunity to become holy. May the saints of God intercede for us this week and may Christ bless us with an abundance of virtue.




