

## Father Patrick

The language of scripture can often be hard to understand due to the context in which it is written. When we are presented with the image of 10 virgins gathering at a wedding it might be difficult to grasp this language since we don't refer to anyone necessarily with this title. However, the context and reality of what is being celebrated is quite relatable. I invite us to think back to the last time we attended a wedding or even your own. There was a great number of people who were called to attend and assist us and the wedding that we hand-picked for the service. These people were there in a big part due to their love of you and their support for what you were about to do. There was a true acceptance of the love you had and the person you were.

Scripture continues to use the language of the wedding feast and the love that is shared between bride and groom. This is a language that we can understand. What is hard to understand is that this love is made available to all. We, the Church, the bride of Christ, are given a profound gift, the love of Jesus Christ. The virgins, those set aside for service of the groom and the bride are invited into this love. The question we must ask ourselves is, "How important is this to us?" The bridegroom is willing to pour out this profound love that can only come from the heart of a true lover. We are called to share that same profound intimate love with him as well.

This weekend we come to the end of Vocations Awareness Week. We are called into a profound life, a profound relationship with Christ which can be called our vocation. I pray that no matter what vocation we have we are constantly filling up our oil lamps, our hearts, with the fuel that is needed to keep the fire of our hearts burning by committing ourselves to the life that is necessary for the vocation that Christ has called us.






