Blessed New Year and Advent to all. So, we begin again a new liturgical year rooted in the life of Christ seen through the lens of the liturgy. We are blessed as a people to have such an amazing gift to encounter Christ through prayer, the word, and the Eucharistic presence. The Church through the guidance of the Holy Spirit has provided us an opportunity each day to enter even deeper into the life of Christ, responding to the command of Christ to come follow me. It is for this reason that we can say that liturgy, especially the Mass, is the most important activity we can participate in. With that being said it is for this reason that we are continuing to find ways to elevate the liturgical practice of our four-parish family, especially during the nationwide Eucharistic Revival.

The first step in this process has been to gather representatives from all four parishes to form a joint liturgy committee. This committee meets quarterly to discuss upcoming liturgical events, any concerns, questions, and changes in the liturgy as a whole, and to discuss the GIRM (the General Instruction of the Roman Missal – the guidelines put forward by the Catholic Bishops in the United States). The main focus of this group is to guide our four parishes in the unity of worship in the liturgy as well as grow to become more united with the Church as a whole in celebrating the liturgy in the way they desire it to be celebrated.

We have also begun discussion and formation with our liturgical ministers in all four parishes which includes Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Lectors, Music Ministers, and Altar Servers. As we meet with each group our goal is first to create a more general norm of service for all four churches in each ministry as well as to update each ministry in order to align them all the more to the vision of the Church for each ministry.

As you might notice we continue to work always for Christ and His Church in our four-parish family and I realize that I don't always communicate clearly what we are doing and why. Please accept my apologies in this matter. The changes we have made and will make I will be doing my best through the bulletin, pulpit announcements, and letters to keep you updated and informed better in the future. We will be providing a weekly note in the bulletin to explain different aspects of the liturgy titled "Mass – Did you Know?". This week I begin with a simple explanation of the advent wreath and candles.

I greatly appreciate everyone's thoughts and concerns about how we worship in our four parishes and I will continue to do everything I can to help us grow as a parish in worship together as Christ and His Church long for us to do. If anyone has any questions or concerns please feel free to ask.

I also would like to remind everyone of our new Mass schedule for weekdays. Note that these changes were made for two reasons. Firstly, to accommodate my new weekly schedule so that I am available on Mondays while Fr. Julian is taking his day off and so that I can take Fridays off when able. The changes also are to provide daily Masses at a central location for all four parishes to the best of our abilities. Finally, it is to be more in line with the desire of the Church for priests to celebrate one daily Mass when possible. Please see the bulletin for the new Mass schedule and note that the changes include a 12:15pm Mass on Mondays at Holy Rosary starting December 4 and no Mass on Thursdays at Good Shepherd and Fridays at Sacred Heart. Again, may all have a blessed Advent and I pray we all grow in holiness this new liturgical year drawing closer to Christ in the Mass.

What is an Advent Wreath and Why is it in Church?

The advent wreath, evergreen and in a circle as a symbol of eternal life in Christ, holds four candles. There are four candles placed in the wreath, three purple and one pink. The candles are lit in order adding a candle each week representing the brightening of light as Christ draws nearer. The first purple candle represents Hope, the second purple candle represents faith, the third candle is Pink and represents Joy, and the final purple candle is lit representing Peace.
