Father Patrick

Come, Lord Jesus, come! As we continue to celebrate this great gift of Advent we continue to grow in our anticipation and coming of Christ each Mass. During this three-year process of Eucharistic Revival, we are taking time to grow in our celebration of the liturgy and service to it especially in each of our liturgical ministries. I will be taking time to explain these changes more thoroughly over the weeks and months to come through bulletin articles, posts in the bulletin as well as announcements at Mass and homilies. I would like to address the changes we are making with our servers in the four-parish family. I have added to the United States Bishop's guidelines with some of our own additions for our parish community. The following guidelines were prepared by the Committee on the Liturgy and presented to the National Conference of Catholic Bishops for discussion at the June 1994 Special Assembly on Thursday, June 16, 1994.

- 1. The diocesan bishop may permit the liturgical functions of the instituted acolyte to be carried out by altar servers, men and women, boys and girls. Such persons may carry out all the functions listed in no. 100 (with the exception of the distribution of Holy Communion) and nos. 187-190 and no. 193 of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal. The determination that women and girls may function as servers in the liturgy should be made by the bishop on the diocesan level so that there might be a uniform diocesan policy. (Our Bishop has allowed both boys and girls to serve.)
- 2. No distinction should be made between the functions carried out in the sanctuary by men and boys and those carried out by women and girls. The term "altar boys" should be replaced by "servers". The term "server" should be used for those who carry out the functions of the instituted acolyte. (After discussion and guidance from our four parishes we will be having both servers' groups of boys and girls. We will begin to form them separately with an emphasis on discernment of vocation to priesthood for the boys and discernment of religious life for the girls as well as encouraging leadership amongst these groups. The document published in 1994 by the Congregation on Divine Worship on "Vatican Communication on Female Altar Servers" says that "the Holy See wishes to recall that it will always be very appropriate to follow the noble tradition of having boys' servers at the altar. As is well known, this has led to a reassuring development of priestly vocations." With that being said I would like to uphold the

priestly vocations." With that being said I would like to uphold the current tradition of girl servers with emphasis on the development of religious vocations for them as well as encouraging girls to join the Handmaid's of the Lord for this same purpose.)

- 3. Servers should be mature enough to understand their responsibilities and to carry them out well and with appropriate reverence. They should have already received holy communion for the first time and normally receive the eucharist whenever they participate in the liturgy. (It is for this reason that we start training in 4th grade at this time.)
- 4. Servers should receive proper formation before they begin to function. The formation should include instruction on the Mass and its parts and their meaning, the various objects used in the liturgy (their names and use), and the various functions of the server during the Mass and other liturgical celebrations. Servers should also receive appropriate guidance on maintaining proper decorum and attire when serving Mass and other functions.
- 5. Acolytes, altar servers, readers, and other lay ministers may wear the alb or other suitable vesture or other appropriate or dignified clothing. (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, no.339) All servers should wear the same liturgical vesture. (We are encouraging the wearing of cassock and surplus as a way to emphasize the unique role of the server as well as differentiate between the priest who is in alb and the server who is in cassock and surplus).

We will continue to do the best we can to communicate the ways we are trying to best follow the Church and lead our parish ever closer to Christ. The altar guild will be formed by Fr. Julian on 1st Saturdays for the boys from 10:00am to 12:00pm and all boys are welcome to come to be trained and enjoy fellowship, and fun. The girls will be trained, enjoy fellowship, and have fun with Fr. Patrick on third Saturdays from 10:00am to 12:00pm as well as invited to join the Handmaids of the Lord on 2nd Saturdays from 10:00am to 12:00pm for formation, fellowship, and fun. I am sending out a letter to all parents in our parishes as well to better communicate these ministries and invite their children to join us.

GIRM #53 (The General Instruction of the Roman Missal) "Gloria in Excelsis Deo" (the Latin for Glory to God in the Highest) which is normally sung at every Sunday Mass was sung on the night that Christ was born by the angels to the shepherds in the field around Bethlehem. We refrain from singing this song leading up to Christmas as a sign of waiting in anticipation for the joy of Christ's birth.
