

Father Patrick

Throughout much of if not all of Advent, we continue to hear a message of wait, patience, not yet. However, today in our readings for this the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time we hear a much different message, now! In a time when we are often frozen by indecision or the complication of too many decisions we are called by Christ to make one very simple and very lifechanging decision, we are to choose Christ.

The Gospel for this Sunday is that of the call of Peter and Andrew along with James and John. There is not much else that is included. Were there any previous conversations? Did they take time to talk it over with their family? Did they take time to pray on it? Simply put, they were asked to follow Christ and they followed. This direct and abrupt statement gets directly to the point. In all things, we are called to follow the Lord. This decision clearly requires discernment on how but that we do so is undeniable, we must follow Jesus.

In our call to be disciples of the Lord the process of discernment or the decision process that is taken to best follow Jesus one of the hardest processes is to know what is keeping us from deciding to follow Christ more closely. "They left their nets and followed him." In making this decision to follow Christ it is most challenging to repent or to leave behind the things that are holding me back from following him more. This process of letting go is an extremely important process and is very difficult but in the case of the fisherman, it seemed not too challenging. This might be in a big way because it is much easier to let go of things if we know that we are embracing something much better.

Let us take time to better discern what things we are holding onto, and what beliefs, ideas, or things that hold us back. I also pray that we take time to grow more importantly in believing in the Gospel, the truth that Christ is worth following, and that Christ is everything. He is truly worth following Christ, worth everything.




Announcing a Lifeline of Hope and Healing for Struggling Marriages!

Mass — Did you Know?

When Do I Bow or Genuflect at Church and in Mass? As mentioned in an earlier question and answer the GIRM (general instruction for the Roman Missal) paragraph 275 states "a bow signifies reverence and honor shown to the persons themselves or to the signs that represent them. There are two kinds of bow: a bow of the head and a bow of the body." This would include bowing toward the altar. The paragraph before it says "a genuflection, made by bending the right knee to the ground, signifies adoration, and therefore it is reserved for the Most Blessed Sacrament, as well as for the Holy Cross from the solemn adoration during the liturgical celebration on Good Friday until the beginning of the Easter Vigil." In conclusion, when entering into the presence of the Eucharist, whether the tabernacle is located at the front of Church or in a small side chapel a sign of reverence towards the Eucharistic presence is encouraged all other times when passing or entering into the presence of the altar we would bow.
