

This weekend, we will have our yearly blessing of throats after all Masses. This great saint of Sebastea, an early 4th century bishop and martyr, established for us this unique tradition of blessings that has become a staple for us as a Church. St. Blaise was known for his great holiness among the people of Armenia. He often gathered crowds of people to heal them through the power of Christ. His virtue was known to many and his prayers often healed not only people but animals as well. I stumbled upon the great story that lies behind the tradition of blessing with candles that comes from the life of St. Blaise. Now many of you probably know the story of how he removed the fishbone from the boy's throat as the origin of the blessing, but there is another story attached with the tradition of using two candles for the blessing.

A poor old widow in Sebastea who possessed only a small pig, was discovered by a ravenous wolf, and one day the wolf came by and snatched away her pig. The woman implored St. Blaise to get her pig back out of fear of starvation. The saint smiled at her and said: "Good woman, don't be sad, your pig will be returned to you." Within minutes, in her amazement, the wolf came back and dropped the pig at her feet and trotted off into the woods. Later, when St. Blaise was returning to Sebastea, by the prefect's order, he was arrested for his faith and locked in prison. The poor widow who heard what had happened to St. Blaise delivered to him a plate of pork, a loaf of bread, and two small candles to give him warmth and light in prison. This small gift of two candles is the origin of our tradition of blessing with two candles.

For St. Blaise, these gifts must have given him hope and strength in that dark place, a reminder that Christ, the light of the world, shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it. Soon thereafter, St. Blaise would be beaten, scraped by combs, and beheaded as a martyr. I'd like to think that it was these two candles that reminded to St. Blaise in his final perseverance to remain faithful to the light of the world and to embrace a sacrificial death. Can you imagine the darkness that must have surrounded him in prison, the possible feelings of abandonment, and thoughts of death? But then think of the great joy that he must have felt upon receiving those gifts from the widow! The light that he received from the two candles that pierced the darkness of his cell, the comfort he must have felt in knowing that he was both loved by the people that he served and by His Lord who is the light of His life. This gift that once gave light to a saint is now a sacramental to be used for spiritual and physical healing. Christ is our true light and we ask for His special grace this day as he offers us this great blessing.

With Christ as our light, nothing can defeat us. No amount of darkness, or sin, pain, or poor health, illness, anxiety, nor poor night of sleep can defeat us when we have Christ's light to guide us. And if ever we begin to lose hope, we can always look to the sanctuary wherein we will find the light of the world symbolized by a candle, perpetually lit near the tabernacle. Even if we say with the Psalmist: let the darkness hide me and the light around me be night, we will know that even darkness is not dark for the Lord and the night is as clear as the day.

It is not group therapy. Costs are affordable and no couple is turned away because of limited finances. Fasting and Not Eating Meat on Friday During Lent —

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Snacking between meals is not permitted on days of fasting. While fasting Catholics should not eat meat on Ash Wednesday or Good Friday. Catholics ages 18 to 59 are expected to Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. Which means we are not supposed to eat meat on Friday during Lent. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age 14 and older.



Mass — Did you Know?

Why do we use a crucifix at church and why do we use the crucifix for procession but not place it in a prominent place in church?"

The cross with the image of Christ crucified is a reminder of Christ's paschal mystery. It draws us into the mystery of suffering and makes tangible our belief that our suffering when united with the passion and death of Christ leads to redemption. There should be a crucifix 'positioned either on the altar or near it, and ... clearly visible to the people gathered there.' Since a crucifix placed on the altar and large enough to be seen by the congregation might well obstruct the view of the action taking place on the altar, other alternatives may be more appropriate. The crucifix may be suspended over the altar or affixed to the sanctuary wall. A processional cross of sufficient size, placed in a stand visible to the people following the entrance procession, is another option. If the processional cross is to be used for this purpose, the size and weight of the cross should not preclude its being carried in procession. If there is already a cross in the sanctuary, the processional cross is placed out of view of the congregation following the procession." (Built of Living Stones 91)

Everyday Stewardship Recognize God In Your Ordinary Moments The Audacity of Holiness

Do you know a holy person? I'm not talking about piety — that's important, too, in its own way. But right now, I'm speaking of holiness.

St. Therese of Lisieux called holiness "a disposition of the heart that makes us humble and little in the arms of God, aware of our weakness, and confident — in the most audacious way — in His Fatherly goodness."

The holy person sees a storm on the horizon of life, and rather than give themselves over to fear and despair (natural and understandable reactions), regards the gathering winds as an opportunity to rely more fully on God. The holy person takes a bad situation and sanctifies it with charity and understanding that defies our fallen human nature.

Peter's mother-in-law was still in the throes of a fever when Jesus grasped her hand. It wasn't until she took his hand and allowed him to help her up that "the fever left her and she waited on them." Before the fever could leave her, she had to commit to holiness — to put her trust in him in a most audacious way. She had to find it within herself to lift her weakened hand to grasp his — and as soon as she did, she was rewarded. Her bodily health restored, she gave thanks, and attended to his needs.


