Father Patrick

No one likes to be sick. However, it is a common struggle we all go through. Sickness is a result of the brokenness of our world and our humanity but it is not beyond the reach of God. We know that though we are broken sinners, God sent His Son into our sickness, into our brokenness, not simply to take it away but to redeem it. This is the reason why our risen Lord still has His wounds but in a redeemed form. Thanks be to God we have a God who is willing not simply to fix our problems but to enter into them.

This is why we have the amazing gift of the anointing of the sick. This weekend we celebrate the day of prayer of the sick throughout the church. This is a day when we ask the Lord to be with those who are suffering countless forms of sickness and health issues. We are also asking Him to bring His healing love and mercy. However, this act of anointing is not simply a magical formula used to take away sickness but to allow for God's mercy to work in our weakness.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "In the Church's Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. His cures were signs of the arrival of the Kingdom of God. The core message of his healing tells us of his plan to conquer sin and death by his dying and rising.

The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient.

When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it is God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age."

Therefore, if anyone you know has a serious illness and condition that is threatening their life we strongly encourage you to seek out the anointing of the sick. We are offering this great sacrament this weekend after Mass for all in need however Fr. Julian and I are more than willing to come to you or your loved one whenever needed. For those who are suffering any illness or health problem that is not life threatening, we still encourage you to come to Christ in the Eucharist and the priest. We would love to pray with you and support you in your suffering and to know that Christ is nearest to those who are united to His Cross.

Please know of our prayers for all who are suffering and our desire for you all to approach Christ, the God who suffered for us.

Why do we have only so many lay people distributing communion?

When the size of the congregation or the incapacity of the bishop, priest, or deacon requires it, the celebrant may be assisted by other bishops, priests, or deacons. If such ordinary ministers of Holy Communion are not present, "the priest may call upon extraordinary ministers to assist him, i.e., duly instituted acolytes or even other faithful who have been deputed for this purpose. In case of necessity, the priest may also depute suitable faithful for this single occasion (GIRM 162) in accordance with the churches guidelines we are deeming the size of our congregation that needs extraordinary ministers to be 100. When there are more than 100 people we will call upon an extraordinary minister to assist and if there are more than 200 we will call on two and so on.
