

Do we really need to confess our sins to a priest? Great question!

YES! There is power in the sacrament of Penance! "The glory of God is man fully alive." No greater words have ever been spoken by St. Irenaeus, a second century Greek bishop and recent doctor of the church. FULLY ALIVE in God is, by its very nature, participating in ALL that He has given to us for our good and His glory.

The false idea that we are able to go directly to God to have our sins forgiven without the completion of private confession has been a misleading position for many years, but turning to Sacred Scripture and the Bride of Christ (the Church) who is governed by the Holy Spirit, we see that God's intention was, is and always will be one of FULL COMMUNION!

This profound GIFT of being "fully alive" in God (full communion) presents itself over and over again and is present in the Sacrament of Penance as much as in any other dimension of the church. We all know that God is God and we are not! When God speaks...IT IS...and so when He speaks, He binds Himself to whatever He says.

When Jesus instituted the sacraments (fully disclosed in sacred scripture) God <u>binds Himself to</u> these efficacious signs of grace. By binding Himself to the Sacraments, He is telling us in no uncertain terms that this is His will for us and it is of eternal importance. In instituting the sacraments, God binds Himself to these sacred mysteries for our good, so that we may be FULLY ALIVE in His Glory. God is pure love and as the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches starting at paragraph 293, "The world was made for the glory of God! God created all things not to increase His glory but to show it forth and to communicate it. For God has no other reason for creating than His love for us and the goodness He wants to give us!"

In John's gospel chapter 20:19-23 Jesus institutes the sacrament of Penance with the words, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent Me, so I send you." And He breathed on them, and said to them, "If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven, if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." From the moment those words were spoken until today each and every priestly ordination makes present this healing sacrament. Just a few short weeks ago we heard in our Gospel reading the healing of the leprous man and Jesus' command to, "Go show yourself to the priest." It was clear then and it is clear now, go show yourself to the priest. When we put off confessing our sins to a priest, and instead resort to the attitude of going only to God in our thoughts, we are ultimately saying to God, "I know better...You may have instituted the sacraments, but I want to do it my way." Confession can strike fear and anxiety in even the most devout catholics, and we all know where fear comes from...the evil one. As long as fear rules the hearts and minds of God's people, Satan will continue to hold us captive from being FULLY ALIVE as God's beloved. John 10:10 warns, "The thief comes only to steal, kill and destroy. I have come so that you may have life and have it to the full." Brothers and sisters, I pray that we the faithful will recognize the beautiful gift in this profound sacrament. For more information I invite you to reference the Catechism of the Catholic

First Communion Retreat — This coming Saturday, March 9th all students preparing for their First communion in April should plan on attending the First Communion Retreat here at Holy Rosary. The event is for students and their parents from all four of our parishes. The retreat will be from 9:00am to 12:30pm. Lent is a good time to go to Confession. Catholics are expected to go to Confession at least once a year. As we prepare for Easter during Lent, now is a good time to take advantage of this sacrament. Some people might ask why go Confession? Relinquish Your Guilt - Living a life full of unforgiven sins separates us from God and can be tiresome. Sin weighs on our hearts, causing us to feel ashamed and guilty. Unfortunately, this guilt and fear of judgment prevent some people from confessing, which only worsens how a person feels over time. Talking to God through a trusted priest allows you to experience emotional, physical and spiritual benefits.

Experience Divine Forgiveness — Confession allows us to confess our sins and experience true forgiveness from our Lord. Fortunately, there is no question whether you are forgiven or not when it comes to a valid confession and to our Lord. If you confess all of your mortal sins and are truly sorry for them, your soul is cleansed when the priest recites the words of absolution. During a confession, Christ is sacramentally present in the confession via the priest's person.

40 Can for 40 Days — The Knights of Columbus are collecting food items and cash donations during Lent to help people in need in the Medford Area. Mass — Did you Know?

Why do the prayers, Mass parts, and eucharistic prayers change?

You might have noticed that during Lent we have changed the penitential rite to a simpler form and we have been using different eucharistic prayers. The Mass was written with options. These options are provided for the particular needs of the community in relationship to the particular spiritual need of the liturgical season. The church does recognize "The liturgy of the Eucharist unfolds according to a fundamental structure which has been preserved throughout the centuries down to our own day" (CCC1346) With this in mind the church also recognizes, "the pastoral effectiveness of a celebration will be greatly increased if the texts of the readings, the prayers, and the liturgical chants correspond as aptly as possible to the needs, the preparation, and the culture of the participants. This will be achieved by appropriate use of the many possibilities of choice. Hence, in arranging the celebration of Mass, the Priest should be attentive rather to the common spiritual good of the People of God than to his own inclinations. He should also remember that choices of this kind are to be made in harmony with those who exercise some part in the celebration, including the faithful, as regards the parts that more directly pertain to them." (GIRM 352)






