

# Father Julian

Happy Sunday! I hope that this season has been treating you all well throughout this strange winter. We have been having a busy past few weeks, but the Lord is clearly at work in our parish community and we give thanks to God for all the blessings he has bestowed upon us during this season of renewal and repentance. It is also exciting to see the many new changes that have taken place during our construction project here at Holy Rosary. It is amazing to see the many hands that have contributed to this important work and to watch it slowly come together. The Church flooring, entrance, lighting, and sanctuary space are slowly coming back to life, and we give thanks to God for all who have contributed so much to this beautiful renovation.

Throughout the Church's history, Church architecture has created an enormous impact on us as the body of Christ; and that is exactly what the Church space represents. It is not just a space that we use for Mass and prayer. It is a physical sign of the beauty of the Church and the dwelling place of God Himself! Yes, the space is used for practical purposes like seating for the congregation, and it should be practical and useable. However, this should not overshadow the symbolic expression that this space ought to reveal the glory of Christ. As much as we occupy this space for our liturgies and use it for our celebrations, the beauty of the Church is also meant to proclaim God's glory.

Our Pope emeritus once said: "When faith, celebrated in a particular way in the liturgy, encounters art, a profound synchrony is created, because both can and want to praise God, making the Invisible visible." The Church building is a space set aside for proclaiming God's dwelling place. The art and architecture proclaim and give praise to God's glory present on earth among us. Recall that Jesus is Emmanuel, which means "God with us." His presence among us in our Church space is worth our praise!

The Church tells us that "church buildings and the religious artworks that beautify them are forms of worship in themselves that both inspire and reflect the prayer of the community as well as the inner life of grace. Conversely, church buildings and religious artifacts that are trivial, contrived, or lack beauty can detract from the community's liturgy." (Built of Living Stones, 18) Having a beautiful church space is not simply about creating a nice place for us to pray. It is a form of worshipping God through the hand of the artist and the beauty of the liturgy. They are in themselves a form of worship. In the same way, art that lacks beauty detracts from this goal. Each part of our church space in its own way gives glory to God by the expression of the craftsman and the artist. The flooring, ceiling, windows, pews, sanctuary, tabernacle, altar, ambo, and lighting are all parts that contribute to our duty to "worship God in the splendor of His Holiness." (1 Chronicles 16:29)

As we continue our journey awaiting the completion of our renovation project, may we always recognize and identify the great importance that art and architecture play in our Catholic tradition. Let us pray that these spaces not only contribute to our future celebrations but also give glory to God.

# Mass — Did you Know?

Kyrie, eleison, meaning Lord have Mercy, is actually in Greek and finds its origins in some of the earliest Masses of the church even before it was celebrated in Latin.

"The word mercy in English is the translation of the Greek word eleos. This word has the same ultimate root as the old Greek word for oil, or more precisely, olive oil; a substance which was used extensively as a soothing agent for bruises and minor wounds. The oil was poured onto the wound and gently massaged in, thus soothing, comforting and making whole the injured part. The Hebrew word which is also translated as eleos and mercy is hesed, and means steadfast love. The Greek words for 'Lord, have mercy,' are 'Kyrie, eleison' that is to say, 'Lord, soothe me, comfort me, take away my pain, show me your steadfast love.' Thus, mercy does not refer so much to justice or acquittal a very Western interpretation but to the infinite loving-kindness of God, and his compassion for his suffering children! It is in this sense that we pray 'Lord, have mercy,' with great frequency throughout the Divine Liturgy."

In light of this explanation the phrase comes alive and highlights the beauty and depth of God's mercy. It shows a loving God who wants to bind our wounds like the Divine Physician he is. Instead of standing in front of a tribunal at the beginning of Mass asking for mercy from a powerful judge, we are face-to-face with a compassionate God, who is ready to pick us up when we fall down.

So, while it may seem strange to speak Greek words at Mass, the Church chose those words centuries ago specifically for their deep and powerful meaning.






