

We will begin allowing for the reception of Holy Communion in both kinds, in Christ's Body and His Blood, starting on the feast of Holy Thursday during Holy Week, March 28th. As it states in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, "the sign of communion is more complete when given under both kinds, since in that form the sign of the Eucharistic meal appears more clearly." With this being said, as it is explained more clearly throughout the rest of this article, all are encouraged to receive the Eucharist, if in the state of grace, either in the Body and or the Blood. It is not an expectation that you receive in both. There will be an offering of both if desired. We continue to encourage a great sense of reverence around the reception of Christ in both Kinds and pray we may be able to encounter Him more fully through this great gift of the Eucharist.

The Church has always taught that each species contains both the Body and Blood of Christ. This dogma was reaffirmed at the Council of Trent:

"Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly his body that he was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church of God, and this holy Council now declares again, that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. This change the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called transubstantiation." (Denzinger-Schönmetzer, 1642)

The document "Norms for the Distribution and Reception of Holy Communion Under Both Kinds in the Dioceses of the United States of America" states:

"It should never be construed, therefore, that Communion under the form of bread alone or Communion under the form of wine alone is somehow an incomplete act or that Christ is not fully present to the communicant. The Church's unchanging teaching from the time of the Fathers through the ages—notably in the ecumenical councils of Lateran IV, Constance, Florence, Trent, and Vatican II—has witnessed to a constant unity of faith in the presence of Christ in both elements.

Even in the earliest days of the Church's life, when Communion under both species was the norm, there were always instances

when the Eucharist was received under only the form of bread or wine. . . . Thus, the Church has always taught the doctrine of concomitance, by which we know that under each species alone, the whole Christ is sacramentally present and we receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace." (15)

There have been times throughout history where the distribution of Communion has been limited to one form for reasons of practicality or to combat heresy. In the early Church, for example, where the Eucharist was received generally under both kinds on Sundays, Communion under the form of bread alone allowed for daily reception where Mass was not possible. Likewise, beginning in the late 1200s, distribution of Communion under one form only was required in order to combat the heretical teaching of some that reception under both kinds was necessary in order to receive the whole Christ.

By the time of Vatican II, the Council saw no reason not to begin restoring the reception of Communion under both kinds. This was done in stages. In 1970 the Holy See approved for the United States the bishops' *Appendix to the General Instruction for the Dioceses of the United States*, which gave permission for Communion under both kinds at weekday Masses (AGI 242:19).

The Holy See extended this permission in 1984 to Sunday Masses in the U.S., when it approved the bishops' directory, *This Holy and Living Sacrifice: Directory for the Celebration and Reception of Communion under Both Kinds*. The directory stated that, in addition to weekday Masses, "Communion under both kinds is also permitted at parish and community Masses celebrated on Sundays and holy days of obligation in the dioceses of the United States" (HLS 21).

The only exceptions are in those cases where the size or circumstance of the congregation would not permit reverent reception of the precious blood or when the congregation is so diverse that the priest cannot tell if its members have been sufficiently instructed about receiving Communion under both kinds. "Communion under both kinds is to be desired in all celebrations of the Mass, though this is not possible in all cases" (HLS 19).

### Religious Education "News You Need to Know"

Confirmation Retreat — This Saturday and Sunday, March 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> we will be hosting the Confirmation Retreat here at Holy Rosary. The Confirmation Retreat is for students from all 4 parishes. The Spiritus team is onsite to run the retreat. The Spiritus team will be speaking at our Masses during the retreat weekend to introduce themselves and talk about their mission. Please pray for all the students attending the retreat. The Confirmation Retreat while a requirement to be Confirmed is an important step for the students. The retreat gives them a chance to reflect on how they are doing in their faith journey and their relationship with Jesus.

Next week is Palm Sunday. Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, and the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ into Jerusalem, days before he was crucified. Palm Sunday is known as such because the faithful will often receive palm branches which they use to participate in the reenactment of Christ's arrival in Jerusalem. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect. Palm branches are widely recognized symbol of peace and victory, hence their preferred use on Palm Sunday. 

### Mass — Did you Know?

### Why do we cover the statues and crucifix during Lent?

In the *Roman Missal* we find the instruction, "In the Dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from [the fifth] Sunday [of Lent] may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil."

But why go through such lengths to cover up images that are designed to raise our hearts and minds toward heaven? First of all, we use veils to alert us of the special time that we are in. When we walk into church and notice everything is covered, we immediately know that something is different. These last two weeks of Lent are meant to be a time of immediate preparation for the Sacred Triduum and these veils are a forceful reminder to get ready. Secondly, the veils focus our attention on the words being said at Mass. When we listen to the Passion narrative, our senses are allowed to focus on the striking words from the Gospel and truly enter into the scene. Third, the Church uses veils to produce a heightened sense of anticipation for Easter Sunday. This is further actualized when you attend daily Mass and see the veils each day. You don't want them to be there because they are hiding some very beautiful images.


