

Happy Easter! Though it doesn't necessarily look like it outside we are in the season of Easter. I realize that it is hard to fully embrace the "joy" of Easter when there is snow outside. Blooming flowers, sunny and crisp mornings, and birds chirping seem to not simply usher in Spring but Easter as well. This is not simply due to the fact that it happens this way every year. Throughout the world, Easter has been and will continue to be a "season" of new, of life, of renewal. The weather doesn't have to cooperate to do so.

We are all in need of this renewal, of new life, of new beginnings. It is for this reason we were called to "die" this Lent so that we can "rise" this Easter. There is a necessary invitation by Christ to receive the renewal that comes from repentance, from forgiveness of sins, from accepting more fully the life of Christ this Easter. The fact that Jesus spent 40 days with His disciples trying to drive this home is extremely important but we recognize that this was not the primary purpose of His remaining with them after the Resurrection. He was training them.

"These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled. He opened their minds to understand Scriptures." Christ is constantly trying to remind us what He has already done, show what already has been revealed, and teach what already has been taught. There is a reason Christ continues to work in our lives, freeing us from sin, and more importantly, helping others to do the same. "Thus, it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all nations."

This is the training the disciples received and so do we if we are willing to accept it. The whole purpose of the Easter season is to refocus on the newness of life Jesus suffered and died for. The whole reason He came into the world and the whole reason He shared it with us. So that we can share that message with others. We are all called to grow in accepting the freedom of Christ through repentance and forgiveness of sins. Let us grow in sharing that with the world.



Mass — Did you Know?

Why do we use bells at Mass?

In the Roman Rite handbells were eventually used by altar servers to mark important moments during the Mass. It currently remains an option, as it is noted in the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, "A little before the Consecration, if appropriate, a minister rings a small bell as a signal to the faithful. The minister also rings the small bell at each elevation by the Priest, according to local custom" (No. 150).

The bells have great spiritual power and alert our senses to what is unfolding before us. They not only provoke our attention, but are also a "joyous noise" at the pivotal moments in the Mass when God comes down from Heaven and takes the appearance of bread and wine.

It is not meant to be a distraction, but another way to praise God and focus our wandering attention. Or as the Psalmist sings, "Praise him with sounding cymbals; praise him with loud clashing cymbals! Let everything that breathes praise the Lord! Praise the Lord!" (Psalm 150:5-6)


