

I'm sure most of you, at some point or another, have experienced pruning a shrub or tree because it was unsightly or flat out dead. This is usually the last ditch effort to bring it back to life. Many times, after pruning around my property, I've wondered if I've done more damage than good. I look upon the work I did and think, "Oh my gosh, maybe I should have left well enough alone." But in due time, you see the beauty, coming through and new growth producing a whole new plant. The stark reality of cutting something away in hopes of giving new life is exactly what our Gospel from the 15th chapter of John is all about this week.

"EVERY branch of mine that bears no fruit, I will take away." These are startling words coming directly from Jesus. Certainly, I have areas in my life that bear little to no fruit, but these areas are comfortable for me or give me some sort of fleeting pleasure, and I prefer to hang onto them. Our Gospel is clear that all areas in one's life should work toward greater good and the greatest good is abiding in the vine which is the source of all life. Jesus does not mix words; We are to produce fruit and it is done in the company of the vine and vinedresser, for apart from them, we can do nothing.

On the Christian walk, the adage "to name it, claim it, and tame it" comes to mind. "So, what does this have to do with pruning, and what is the name we give to such an arduous process? CONVERSION!

Christ invites all to this conversion, without which one cannot enter the kingdom, but shows us in word and deed his father's boundless mercy for them and the vast "joy in heaven over one sinner who repents". All pruning begins with a good hard look at the whole of one's life. We name the areas that cause us to fall, die, or become cut off from the Source of Life. This process can be done in one or more of the following activities. Prayer for sure; fasting, works of mercy, examination of conscience, spiritual direction, acceptance of suffering and many others as outlined in the Catechism of the Catholic Church para. 1435. Once we name these problem areas, we "claim it" by taking it to the "THRONE OF MERCY" (confession). We claim the stuff that makes us spiritually ugly (or dead) and leave it at the foot of the cross. Now we begin to tame these areas with what St. John proclaims in our second reading today, "The way we know that He remains in us is from SPIRIT and TRUTH. The truth of the matter is, nobody wants to look at the ugliness, but like a good arborist, who studies the tree or shrub to find the areas in need of pruning, so too does one look deep within to see where and how such death and decay are causing us to be cut off from the source of life. The fact of the matter is...the human heart can pretend and be preoccupied for a time, with the things that fill our senses with this or that, but sooner or later, the gripping reality comes back to the fact that our hearts are restless until they rest in HIM. Brothers and sisters, my prayer for all of us as we journey through the reality of this Easter season is one of patient endurance. The arduous pruning process helps us to identify the areas in our lives that need to be cut out, allowing us to focus on those special gifts that set us apart and make us unique in the eyes of our Creator. WHAT IS YOUR GIFT? WHERE DO YOU BEAR FRUIT? SEEK TO BEGIN THERE AND ABIDE IN HIM.

Branching Out Isn't Always What It's Cracked Up to Be

"That's a really beautiful tree branch. Man, would you look at the bark on that thing? The others are real duds, but that low -hanging branch has really got it all together."

I've never heard anyone say this. Maybe I just need to hang out with more arborists, but I can't recall ever hearing someone admire the particular beauty of a single branch. When someone comments on a tree, it's usually the whole tree — perhaps a visual element of it, like the color of the leaves or its height. But people don't usually zero in on one branch.

Maybe that's because usually, if one branch is looking a little weak, chances are every other branch is, too.

The Bible tells us that when we bear fruit as good everyday stewards, it is for the Father's glory. We are the branch on His magnificent tree. What we have is from Him, and what we do likewise points back to Him. We also tend to reflect how well the other branches around us are incorporating the nutrients coming their way. That's all fine and good in theory. In practice, it can be an arduous exercise in humility.

When I do something virtuous or charitable or kind, there is a part of me that wants to stand out for it. I think that's true for all of us. We've given of ourselves in some way or overcome some human temptation to accomplish a little bit of good in this world, and even though we know God sees us, we'd really love for everyone else to see it, too.

It's a struggle, for sure. But we need to remember that our fruit belongs to the whole tree.

Grant wisdom and faith to our elected leaders, the people we choose to lead our country, to make choices that are based upon your teaching. Where laws are made that go against your will, give us courage to change policy, not based upon our comfort, but upon principles taught in Scripture. We ask all this in the name of Jesus, our brother and Christ, who lives and reign with you, one God, for ever and ever.

Mass — Did you Know?

What's the purpose of the baptism font in church?

The Catechism states, "visible churches are not simply gathering places but signify and make visible the Church living in this place, the dwelling of God with men reconciled and united in Christ." For this reason, a church is a "sacramental building," [1] one which makes present the otherwise invisible realities of the Catholic faith and leads the viewer to their hidden spiritual meaning. The Book of Blessings in the prayers for blessing a new baptism font says the baptistery is rightly considered one of the "most important parts of a church" because baptism is the "first sacrament of the New Law" in which people receive the "Spirit of adoption" and become "in name and in fact" God's adopted children. The baptism font stands as witness to our relationship with Christ especially in the Mass. The Book of Blessings rightly recommends that in setting up the church, "everything must be arranged to bring out the connection of baptism with the word of God and with the Eucharist, the high point of Christian initiation" (BB, 1083).
