

Happy Sunday!

On August 15, the Church will be celebrating once again the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary into Heaven. This is a holy day of obligation in the Church and is an important Marian feast day for each one of us. We will also be hosting a trip to the Shrine of Our Lady of Champion on a coach bus for this special day to celebrate this feast day. The trip is free of charge, so please sign up by calling the parish office if you would like to attend!

In the Catholic Church, we have four Dogmas for Mary. She is the Mother of God, she was immaculately conceived, She was perpetually a virgin, and she was assumed into heaven. This means that Mary, at the end of her life, was lifted up to heaven to dwell with God forever as the Queen of Heaven. Pope Pius the XII declared this dogma. Mary's assumption is a share in the victory of Christ's resurrection. It is fitting that Mary assumed into heaven because she was the perfect one who followed Christ to His final days in total fidelity throughout His life. Because Mary was perfect in what she did in God's mission through Jesus Christ, she is now seated in heaven as the perfect Mother of God.

Why Mary? She seems to be everywhere in Catholic culture! Sometimes people will say that Mary seems more like a distracting character than someone we should actually consider as helpful in the Christian life. After all, isn't prayer meant to be directed to God not towards another character in the bible? Mary is also a virgin forever and never had relations with a man, even after she bore Jesus into the world. If God the Father is truly Jesus' true Father, and Mary His true Mother, she could not have born Jesus from relations with any other man, even Joseph her earthly husband. Mary was destined for one mission: to bring Jesus into the world and to do so perfectly. She achieved this through God's grace, gave birth to Jesus, and never broke this eternal covenant of virginity with God.

The Church teaches that Mary is the Queen in Christ's kingdom. Why a queen? In ancient times, the King's mother actually reigned as queen among the Israelites, not the king's wife. King Solomon kneeling before Bathsheba is one Old Testament example of Israel's connectedness to this Queenship. Because the Church truly has its roots in the Kingdom of Israel established in David's line, Mary continued Israel's Queenship as queen of heaven, just as Christ continued Israel's kingship as king of heaven.

Mary is not worshiped among Catholics! All prayer is directed to God through Mary's intercession. Our prayer to her honors the fifth commandment: "honor your Father and your Mother." Jesus entrusted her to us when He spoke to St. John while hanging upon the cross "then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother."" (John 19:27) When we involve the saints and Mary as His Mother, who was deeply loved by Christ, our prayer becomes more meaningful. Praying with Mary to God allows us to incorporate God's family who were made to help us worship Him perfectly.

May God bless you this week through Our Lady's Intercession

Mass — Did You Know?

What is different about a Catholic Priest's funeral mass?

I wanted firstly to thank all who attended Fr. Dennis' funeral on July 21st at Holy Rosary Church. This funeral service was unique partly because it was for a priest and meaningful because it was for a priest who served our communities especially Holy Rosary and Good Shepherd for many years.

Due to the fact that a Catholic Priest served the Church throughout their lives the celebration of their death and prayers for their soul reflect this great gift that they gave all of us. Firstly, the body is displayed with the vestments of the priest who dedicated their lives primarily in celebrating the Mass. The body is also displayed with a "full-couch" casket or a casket that you can view the whole body as a reflection of the dignity and importance of the priest's role in our lives and the church's.

When the body is placed in the church for the funeral the book of the Gospel was placed on their casket as a sign of their ministry of proclaiming the Gospel. The body is also placed with the head facing the altar as a sign of their commitment to the altar and their ministry to the Mass. Finally, at the end of the Mass, as the body is placed in the hearse, the priests and congregation gather to sing the Salve Regina. This is the proper hymn that all priests pray throughout the year at the end of night prayer. Night Prayer is one of the 5 prayers of the Liturgy of the Hours that the priest promised the Bishop he would pray the rest of his life. Night Prayer has a focus on our death and our need for God's grace in the moment. We pray to Mary one more time for this priest in his death.

Every priest in the Diocese of Superior has a file containing their funeral plans. This file is updated regularly so that this important moment in the priest's life is cared for and is clearly carried out.




