Peace and Blessings. As we enter the season of change with fall, school, harvest, football and colder weather it's nice to remain rooted in something constant like the liturgical season of ordinary time. Yet this weekend pause and take a step back to remember another constant in our lives that isn't always pleasant to remember, the cross. This weekend's Masses falls on the 14th which is the solemnity of the Exaltation of the Cross. This major feast day in the church seems a little out of place, it's not Lent and don't we spend a whole special day reflecting on the crucifixion on good Friday?

On the 14th of September in the year 362 St. Helena, the mother of Emperor Constatine, discovered the true cross on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Not many years later her son had a church built over this site which is called the Holy Sepulcher, and remains one of the most important places in the whole world. To this day we remember this day as the a day when the actual cross of our Lord remains a sign to us all of the profound love that the Father has for us by sending His Son to die for us.

Christians "exalt" the Cross of Christ as the instrument of our salvation. Adoration of the Cross is, thus, adoration of Jesus Christ, the God Man, who suffered and died on this Roman instrument of torture for our redemption from sin and death. The cross represents the One Sacrifice by which Jesus, obedient even unto death, accomplished our salvation. The cross is a symbolic summary of the Passion, Crucifixion and Resurrection of Christ — all in one image. The Cross — because of what it represents — is the most potent and universal symbol of the Christian faith. It has inspired both liturgical and private devotions: for example, the Sign of the Cross, which is an invocation of the Holy Trinity; the "little" Sign of the Cross on head, lips, and heart at the reading of the Gospel; praying the Stations (or Way) of the Cross; and the Veneration of the Cross by the faithful on Good Friday by kissing the feet of the image of Our Savior crucified.

Placing a crucifix (the cross with an image of Christ's body upon it) in churches and homes, in classrooms of Catholic schools and in other Catholic institutions, or wearing this image on our persons, is a constant reminder — and witness — of Christ's ultimate triumph, His victory over sin and death through His suffering and dying on the Cross. We remember Our Lord's words, "He who does not take up his cross and follow me is not worthy of me. He who finds his life will lose it, and he who loses his life for my sake shall find it" (Mt 10:38,39). Meditating on these words we unite ourselves — our souls and bodies — with His obedience and His sacrifice; and we rejoice in this inestimable gift through which we have the hope of salvation and the glory of everlasting life.

I am also grateful for all those who dedicated their time, talent and treasure for the successful festivals at both Our Lady of Perpetual Help and Good Shepherd. We give thanks to God for all the ways that so many support our church communities and pray it was a blessing to all who were involved.

I also want to invite all to a great opportunity for growth in faith. This Sunday, today, after the 10:30 AM mass at Holy Rosary we will be having another formation gathering. We will be emphasizing the great gift and importance of prayer with a guest speaker, Fr. Isaiah Sschick from Rice Lake where he serves as an associate. Please pray for the fruits of the spirit to be poured out on all who are attending. If you haven't decided to come please consider this great gift of faith



The Cross is Not Negotiable

"Holiness isn't for wimps," Mother Angelica famously said. "And the cross isn't negotiable, sweetheart — it's a requirement."

I love Mother Angelica, and I love this quote. Following God is tough, and to do it you have to make a decision to be tough, to endure tough things — and ultimately, to love the toughness of it all, because within that struggle God meets us with mercy and salvation.

But in light of today's readings, I think Mother Angelica would forgive me for tweaking her words a tiny bit.

Holiness is for wimps, because the cross isn't negotiable.

When the unfaithful among the Israelites were bitten by the serpents, they were healed by looking upon the instrument of their suffering: the serpent itself, mounted on Moses' staff. With a literary flourish that puts Homer and Shakespeare to shame, God inverts that primitive symbol. To heal us, he invites us to look upon the cross — the sacrifice which achieved our redemption.

Jesus came here to die on that cross for us. For the wimps. Because we couldn't do it ourselves, even if we tried. We couldn't right all of our wrongs, not if we had a million years to do it. We would keep screwing it up. We would keep failing. We're wimps; that's what we do.

But the cross — the cross is a magnificent invitation to something more. Divinity Himself, assuming the cloak of flesh and the weight of sin, so that when we look at the cross we might recognize ourselves. So that we might see what we have been, what we are, what we could be.

And none of it is negotiable.




