

I hope you are all having a wonderful week! I wanted to offer a reflection on one of my favorite devotions: The Sacred Heart of Jesus. This image has become a prominent part of my vocation and has drawn me closer to Christ in so many ways.

The beauty of the image of the Sacred Heart is that it not only communicates the very center and origin of Jesus' love, but the heart is also not being consumed by the flame. Like the burning bush before Moses, the divine love of God shines bright, produces heat, and flickers with life that cannot be extinguished. It does not destroy, it does not break down, it does not consume or grow dim. It is ever faithfully burning to reveal its light for us as a source of goodness and never destruction. The heart of Jesus gains nothing for itself in this burning flame, but is lit for others to be captured in its light and warmth to bring them new life.

The sacred heart of Jesus also reveals to us the center of Christ bleeding from the crown that is rapt around Him and draining from its wounds. Love when given with depth and true care for others is painful. It's sacrificial, it requires one's whole self to be poured out for the other. This is the greatest level of love one can give. As the Lord tells us from John's gospel: "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.'

How often do we truly recognize this? How often do we open our minds and hearts to realize the depth of this great sacrifice? To willingly accept the abundant love that pours out upon us that conquered sin by embracing death and His great victory that he won for us, by pouring out His life for us. We should not shy away from the Lord in holding onto the heaviness of this love and the immensity of His sacrifice, but rather cast ourselves in the rays of light that pour out from His heart.

I pray that you will all have a blessed week and that you will encounter the Heart of Christ in a new way today!

I received this letter in an email from Real Life Catholic. It is about when our children leave the faith from Chris Stefanick

I've met so many parents who blame themselves for their children wandering from God and leaving the Church. Can I say this to everyone reading who bears that buren? *Please stop doing that to yourself.* God is a *pretty good* parent, and his first two children rejected him! It's not failed parenting. It's that annoying thing called "free will."

So, what do you do if your adult child wanders from the faith?

Pray and fast. It worked for St. Monica. it's said that she gave birth to her son, Saint Augustine, twice. The first time was physical. The second was spiritual, and through her tears, her prayers, and her fasting. Prayer and fasting are a *powerful* one -two punch. It changes lives. Maybe you're being called to go into a new kind of "labor" for your adult child!

While it's important to challenge them, don't let your relationship become all about that challenge. When you evangelize family members, remember that it's a marathon, not a sprint. Keep loving them. Keep the doors of communication and friendship open. It's okay to speak when the opportunity seems right, but don't make every conversation about *that*.

Never lose hope. Even if you don't get to see your child come back to the faith while you're on earth, never lose hope in Jesus' mercy and in *his* ability to win them back. God loves your children more than you. And he'll never stop working harder than you to bring them home.

This message is true not only for our children. This works for family members and friends. Pray for them. Invite them to come to Mass with you. Be kind and friendly. A little bit of kindness can go a long way.





Most of us love both of those and that can be a problem. If you were to love any of the sets of teams mentioned above, you have a huge problem as well.

Simply put, you can only have one thing that is the most important in your life. When I ask my children what is the most important thing in their lives, they know to respond, "God." But just because you know that is the right answer doesn't make it the truthful answer. Total allegiance to a sports team seems easier. You won't find a Packers fans secretly wearing a Bear's jersey. However, we can find Christians secretly hoarding their money or doing things based solely on the love of money.

Maybe the problem lies in the fact that, at times, we are merely lukewarm fans of Jesus and not disciples. If we truly have matured in our faith and strengthened our relationship with him, then real commitment comes easier. There will always be a temptation for money to take the place of Jesus, but the more committed we are, the harder it is to allow anything to come between us and our God. The question we all must continually ask ourselves is, "Is God truly the most important thing in my




