Grace and Peace to all! The reality of sin and brokenness in the world challenges all of us to once again and so often turn to the foundation of the human spirit innate in all of us. "Charity in truth, to which Jesus Christ bore witness by his earthly life and especially by his death and resurrection, is the principal driving force behind the authentic development of every person and of all humanity." (Benedict XVI - Caritas in Veritate (truth in love) -2009). As we listen this week to the sobering call from the words of Sacred Scripture, we have to ask ourselves difficult and oftentimes disturbing questions. How am I doing in the area of Catholic Social teaching? (at the heart of our readings today) The tenets of Catholic Social teaching encompass what it means to be Catholic. One of these great tenets is the area of concern for human dignity and the common good in society. Catholic social **teaching** is a central and essential element of our faith. Its roots are in the Hebrew prophets who announced God's special love for the poor and called His people to a covenant of love and justice. (that which is due to all) It is a teaching founded on the life and words of Jesus Christ, who came "to bring glad tidings to the poor . . . liberty to captives, recovery of sight to the blind" (Lk 4:18-19), and who identified himself with "the least of these," the hungry and the stranger (cf. Mt 25:45). I have written on this subject in the past but it is good to revisit and renew our commitment to the three basic principles of Catholic Social teaching: Human Dignity, Solidarity and Subsidiarity.

Human dignity-The central principle of Catholic social teaching, which states that every person is created in God's image and likeness, making human life sacred. Solidarity-The virtue of sharing material and spiritual goods with others, even those you don't know or like. Pope Benedict XVI again said that solidarity is "first and foremost a form of assistance to the human person". Subsidiarity-The principle that larger institutions should support local communities and not interfere with them. The term comes from the Latin word subsidium, which means help or assistance. Subsidiarity means that decisions should be made by the people most affected, and that larger groups should only get involved to help smaller groups. As stated, the central principle of Catholic Social teaching is Human dignity.

It is difficult to find the words to articulate the reality of a country divided by violence, by discourse in finding common ground and by the shadow of ignorance when seeking the good, the true and the beautiful. So I will again turn to the Catechism of the Catholic Church for just the right response to difficult realities we face everyday.

"Without the help of grace, men would not know how to discern the often narrow path between the cowardice which gives in to evil, and the violence which under the illusion of fighting evil only makes it worse." This is the path of charity, that is, of the love of God and of neighbor. Charity is the greatest social commandment. It respects others and their rights. It requires the practice of justice, and it alone makes us capable of it. Charity inspires a life of self-giving: "Whoever seeks to gain his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life will preserve it." (CCC 1889) Let us pray for peace! Let us pray for unity! Let us pray for understanding! Let us pray and be the voice of reason...the voice of unobstructed good will to ALL. Lord Jesus, we turn our hearts and minds to the one who understands best the way we should go. Direct our country in a way that reflects the words our Savior gave us... Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.
