Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, I hope that this weekend is treating you well and that you are enjoying the beautiful weather these days! This is one of my favorite times of the year as the trees begin to turn and the fall festivals bring us together as a community of faith. Thank you to all who are contributing their hard work to these celebrations. They are a great way to bring the community together and build relationships as the body of Christ.

Something that I am still learning about parish life and the priesthood is that you can never predict what is going to happen next. You have to be willing and ready for anything and anyone that the Lord sends your way. The life of the Christian disciple is one that always seeks to surrender to God's plan and divine providence, ready or not. We are at the Lord's beck and call. It's something that is both beautiful and life giving, but also very hectic.

For example, just this past week, a few of our school students were waiting to be picked up from school after classes had finished. I guess even Coyote's want a little quiet time with Jesus!" The kids looked at me and laughed. I then turned to one of our teachers to call someone.

Eventually two of our wonderful police officers arrived to check things out. In the meantime, the kids and the teachers wanted to bring him home. After several attempts to get him in a live trap or to spook him off the property, Fr. Patrick came to the rescue and chased him away unscathed. "What could possibly happen next?" I thought to myself.

I'd like to think that this was the Lord's way of reminding us to find refuge in Him when life gets hectic. We all need that time to draw close to the Christ and be with Him in moments of stress. As the Psalmist tells us: "You who dwell in the shelter of the Most High, who abide in the shade of the Almighty, say to the Lord, "My refuge and fortress, my God in whom I trust." I hope that you will find refuge in the Lord this week and spend some quiet time with Him like our little furry visitor.






