

"Jesus told his disciples a parable about the necessity for them to pray always without becoming weary." I found this article concerning an address from Pope Francis a great insight into the struggles of prayer:

"True progress in spiritual life does not consist in multiplying ecstasies, but in being able to persevere in difficult times," the pope said May 19, 2021, during his weekly general audience.

"Walk, walk, walk on and if you are tired, stop a little and then start walking again; but with perseverance," he said.

Both in prayer and in everyday life, he said, the mind often "wanders all over the place" and some find it "hard to dwell for long on a single thought."

"Distractions are not a fault, but they must be fought," he said.
"In the heritage of our faith, there is a virtue that is often forgotten, but which is very present in the Gospel. It is called 'vigilance."

Citing the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the pope said aridity occurs when one's heart "is separated from God" and leaves him or her "with no taste for thoughts, memories and feelings, even spiritual ones."

While the reasons for that sense of aridity may range from physical ailments to inner turmoil, the pope said that often, "we do not really know the reason."

"Spiritual teachers describe the experience of faith as a continuous alternation of times of consolation and desolation; there are times when everything is easy, while others are marked by great heaviness," he explained.

While life is often filled with "gray days," the pope said the danger lies in "having a grey heart; when this 'feeling down' reaches the heart and sickens it."

"This is terrible: one cannot pray, one cannot feel consolation with a gray heart! Or one cannot emerge from spiritual aridity with a gray heart," he said. "The heart must be open and luminous, so that the light of the Lord can enter. And if it does not enter, wait for it, with hope. But do not close it up in grayness."

Lastly, the pope warned that sloth is not only one of the seven deadly sins, but also "a real temptation against prayer and, more generally, against Christian life" that can "lead to the death of the soul."

Pope Francis said that at some point in their lives, "all the saints have passed through this 'dark valley'" and would often recount "evenings of listless prayer, lived without enthusiasm." Nevertheless, believers, like the biblical figure Job, "never stop praying" even when their prayers may seem like protests to God.

"Very often, even protesting before God is a way of praying," the pope said. "And we, who are far less holy and patient than Job, also know that in the end, at the end of this time of desolation, during which we have raised to heaven silent cries and asked, 'Why?' many times, God will answer us.""

Our amazing art teacher, Mrs. Liske, is highlighted this week. Each year, Bishop Powers has requested help from the schools within the Diocese of Superior to assist him with artwork for his Christmas Cards. This year's theme was "The Good News of Great Joy." Luke 2:10 and all the students created their submission during art class. Three students were chosen this year from Holy Rosary:

Grades K-2—Violet Rodriguez-Camarena, 2nd Grade

As always, Mrs. Liske is impressed by the talent and abilities of all of the students, and this occasion is no different. These students showed exceptional artistry combing detail and complexity in their designs. We are very proud of their creativity.



Students in grades 4-6 are participating in an afterschool workshop to crochet a plush chicken. These students had been exposed to crochet two years ago after completing an owl design for the Celebration for Education centerpiece. Crocheting is a great tool to increase fine motor, math, comprehension and problem-solving skills. Once learned, crocheting can bring a sense of calm through its rhythmic patterns and a sense of accomplishment though the project achieved. All beginners feel a bit awkward getting going (trying to hold the yarn and hook while stitching is rather complex), however, the students are excited to complete their finished project. We plan on four sessions total to achieve our fluffy chicken. "Bawk Bawk!!"
