Grace and Peace to you all,

“Let us **fix our gaze on the Father** and Creator of the whole world, and let us **hold to his peace and blessings**, His splendid and surpassing gifts. Let us **contemplate Him** in our thoughts and with our mind’s eye reflect upon the **peaceful and restrained unfolding of His plan**; let us **consider the care** with which He provides for the whole of His Creation.” (St. Clement of Rome - 1st century pope) As you are reading this article, our senior class of students are celebrating the powerful Sacrament of Confirmation with His Excellency Bishop James Patrick Powers this weekend. First I want to thank the students and their parents and sponsors for allowing Jeanette and I to be a part of this beautiful time in their lives. It truly has been a pleasure walking with them thus far on this journey! Secondly, In the words of St. Clement of Rome, I want to challenge the students, and all of us, to reflect on the bold statements above. Let us all continue to **fix our gaze on the ONE** who truly has our best interest at heart. As we navigate the world and all it has to offer, it can be overwhelming and honestly, oftentimes contrary to truth, goodness, and beauty.

"Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD alone! The God of the universe comes to hold each of us in the palm of His hand, caring for us and giving to us in measurable ways His peace and His blessings. **Take time each day to recognize these gifts and thank Him for all we have and continue to receive.**

With all our hearts and with all our souls, with all our minds and with all our strength, let us find our days living in the reality that **HE ALONE IS GOD.**

As we **contemplate His presence and the gift** of eternal love, (His Son sent for OUR sake) let us emulate this love in our own lives. It takes a lifetime of reflection to come to truly appreciate such a gift as this. I pray that we all spend time each day reflecting on Jesus Christ and ALL He has to offer. A common theme among a great many in the world today is the attitude of “restriction”. How can the church tell me what to do? I just want to do as I want; I just want to be FREE! In the words of St. Clement, **“peaceful and restrained unfolding of His plan”** does not mean that God wants to hold you back, stifle your progress, and limit your life. No, actually God wants just the opposite for us. The Lord wants all of us to be all we were created to be! Oftentimes we confuse “choice” for “freedom”. Doing whatever we want is not “FREEDOM”, it’s slavery. Only when we choose Christ and His Church, and live under the aegis of the two great commandments: Loving God with all our hearts, souls, minds and strength and our neighbor as ourselves do we experience true freedom. As we live and move and have our being under the umbrella of God’s great commandments, He demonstrates, opens up, and truly shows us how to be fully alive AND reveals for us a **peaceful and restrained unfolding of His plan.**

Devotions, Explained! Prayer for the Dead

It may seem strange to pray for someone who is already dead and who, according to our earthly reckoning of time, has already undergone judgment. But God is not subject to the constrictions of time as we understand them. Our prayers for the dead are, like our prayers for the living, an expression of charity and the unity that exists between all members of the Body of Christ.

Prayer for the dead is a practice which not only predates Catholicism but predates Jesus Christ, as we see in the Second Book of Maccabees (2 Maccabees 12:42-45).

“By virtue of the ‘communion of saints,’ the Church commends the dead to God’s mercy and offers her prayers, especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf,” says the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 1055).

The most common Catholic prayer for the dead is as follows: “Eternal rest grant unto them, o Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace.”

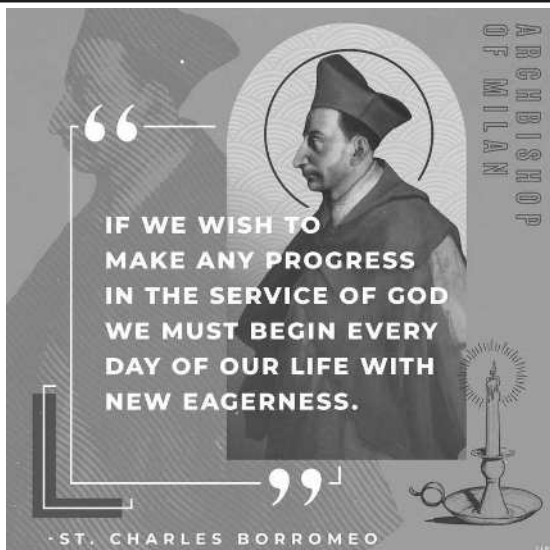
