What makes Catholicism so unique? This question was posed by Matthew Kelly in his book 33 days to Eucharistic Glory. As we consecrate ourselves to the Eucharist this week we recognize that the answer to this question is so important. Matthew Kelly states, "What is the principle differentiator between the Catholic Church and the churches on every other street corner? The Eucharist. Jesus Christ - the King of Kings, the Lord of Lords, the Alpha and the Omega - truly present - Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity - in the Eucharist. He is the difference."

As we celebrate the feast of Christ the King of the Universe, the beginning of rifle deer season, and Thanksgiving I believe this question is really important, what makes my faith as a Catholic so important?

As we recognize the gift of the Eucharist, which literally means thanksgiving, I give thanks to God for not just the Eucharist but who it is, Jesus Christ, our King. As we take time to celebrate and enjoy the outdoors I pray that we aren't simply thanking God but we are actually celebrating that thanksgiving through the greatest gift we have Jesus, in the Eucharist. Let us take time to make Christ the King in our hearts this year by enthroning Him in our hearts through the gift of the Eucharist. Let us take time to thank Him through the gift of the Eucharist, let us take time to answer the question, what makes Catholicism so special, the gift of the Eucharist.

I would also like to invite us all to prepare our hearts of the coming of Advent as we begin in only a week. Please see the bulletin and calendar for all the opportunities we have to grow closer to Christ especially through the Eucharist this Advent. Finally, I invite all to celebrate with both Our Lady of Perpetual Help and Holy Rosary who are both giving thanks to God for a successful campaign and building project. Both parishes will be celebrating with the Bishop on the 6th and 7th of December. Holy Rosary's church will be blessed at the 5PM mass on the 6th and OLPH's church will be blessed at the 8am mass on the 7th. Both will have a gathering afterwards. Let us give thanks to God for His Eucharistic blessings as Christ our King!
