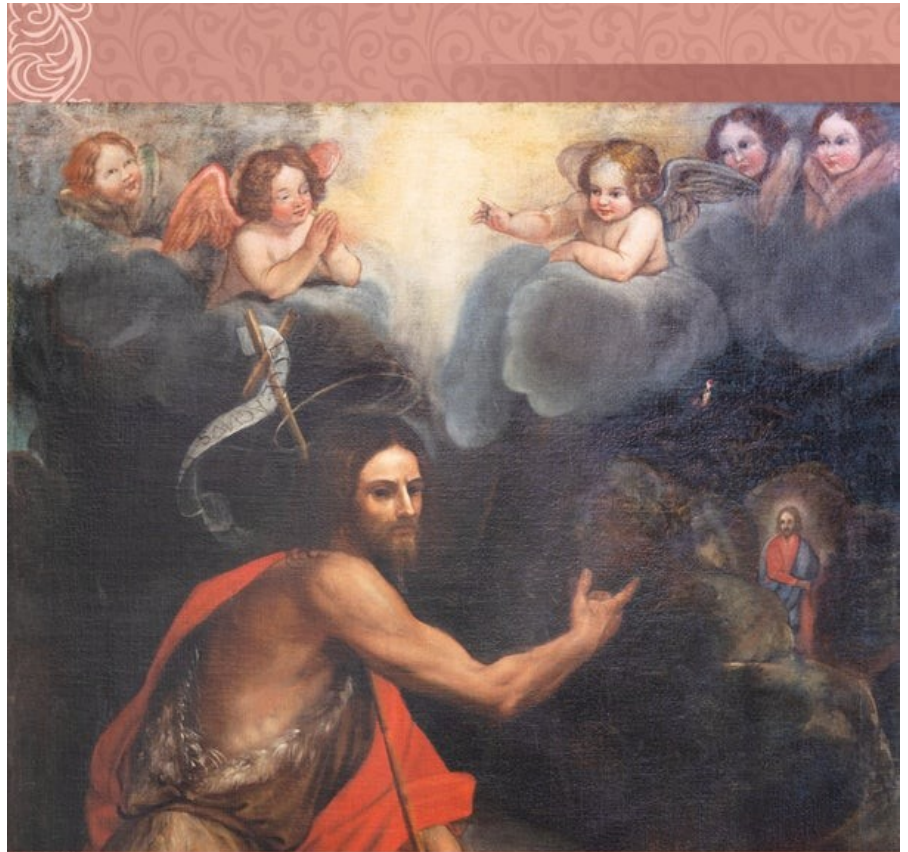

Father Patrick

Big sigh Christmas is over. On Sunday night this was the thought in my heart when I finally finished opening all of my Christmas gifts and cards. (It took me a while this year, thank you all for your generosity and support!). The next thought was now what? How many of us were inundated with people, social events, gatherings, and family time? It would sure be nice to have some normalcy. That's exactly what the Church thinks too. We are entering into a short period of time where the whole Church is being encouraged to get back to normal, or more specifically to order our lives more to Christ's, God's normal.

"To you who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be holy, with all those everywhere who call upon the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, their Lord and ours." From his first letter to Corinthians Paul recognizes an important aspect of the faith, not simply that we are called to Christ but that we are called together. As we continue to grow as intentional disciples it is of great importance to remember what is necessary for this process of discipleship in Christ. As we recall Acts 2:42 "and they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship to the breaking of bread and the prayers."

It is clear in much of our faith that understanding the teaching of the faith, going to mass, and praying are extremely important parts of our faith. How many of us are living the other important part of our faith, FELLOWSHIP? It is very clear that we are called not only to grow in our relationship as individuals but together, supporting and encouraging, sharing and witnessing the faith to one another. This can happen organically in our daily lives in the random encounters we have in our day however if we are to be intentional that we must be creating opportunities to grow in fellowship just as much as the teachings of the faith, the eucharist and prayer.

This is the reason why we as a parish are continuing to encourage the development of small groups in our One Family Parish Community. Small groups, a gathering of four to eight or so Catholics, are an intentional community of those seeking to grow in the faith around a consistent scheduled time and place that allows for ordered, charitable, positive and intentional time to share and grow together. We will be encouraging more small group growth this coming lenten season which is coming up on February 18th. This lent I know we are all being called to grow in a deeper relationship with the Lord, to grow in holiness. Let us not neglect the fellowship that is so important in this process. There are numerous small group leaders that are ready to welcome you to their small group. There will be volunteers after each of the masses this weekend helping to sign people up for these small groups. Please note that there will be opportunities to sign up for a small group over the next couple weeks. Please feel free to call or stop into the office with any questions or if you want to sign up.

I would also ask that we take time to pray for another important mission in our One Family Catholic Community, our school!!! Next weekend, January 25th we kick off Catholic Schools week. This is a time for us to celebrate an amazing gift, our Catholic School and the profound gift of Catholic Education, the opportunity to form children in a relationship with Christ through the Catholic faith. Let us continue to pray for and encourage this great gift in our community.

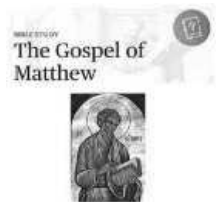

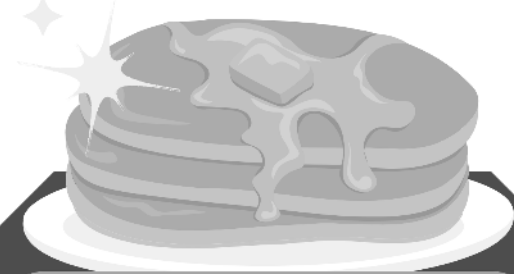
