Father Patrick

Why did Jesus have to spend 40 days in a desert? He is God, right? Pope Benedict XVI calls the temptation of Jesus “a descent into the perils besetting mankind.” This happened so that we may share his image and likeness, not through self-seeking but through the obedience by which “many will be made righteous.” Ultimately, He went to the dessert because Jesus always wants what the Father wants. 40 days in the desert proves the ultimate motivator of Jesus, to do God’s will no matter what.

What is OUR motivation as we enter into the Dessert with Jesus? Days into Lent, a great question to ask is, “why am I doing what I am doing this Lent and is it for God and God alone?” This question, though perfect for Lent, is applicable to all times and in all situations. As a four parish community working together and seeking to live out our mission: *As a Catholic Community of disciples, guided by the Holy Spirit, nourished by the Eucharist, and formed by the Word, we are called by the Father to bring all to Jesus Christ our Savior, we need to continue be open to God’s will as we are doing anything as a Catholic Community of disciples.*

I have included in the bulletin last weekend the new mass times for our One Family Catholic Community. The conversation around what is the best mass times for all has been taking place amongst our leadership since we have been clustered around 4 years ago. After numerous conversations and numerous changes I have defined some guidelines that have helped with the development of our current mass schedule. 1) We need adequate time for our priests to be present to the parish community after mass and get to the next mass. 2) Each parish has a certain number of masses that is needed to serve their own community. 3) All of our mass times are not determined primarily by what one church wants but what works best for four parishes. 4) We are being called to approach each mass time as not simply my mass time or my church's mass time but our mass time, we are part of a larger community now.

As we move forward with these new mass times I ask that we take time to pray for all those who are affected by these changes. I pray that not only are we mindful of others in this process of change but that we are mostly mindful of God. May we ask the Lord how we may grow closer to Him through these changes. I thank you all for your understanding and your openness to God’s will throughout this process.

These changes will take place officially for all four parishes on April 11th & 12th, the weekend after Easter.

Friday, March 6th at 6:00 pm

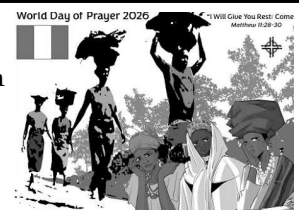
Our Saviour's Lutheran of Holoway will host this year's World Day of Prayer service on Friday, March 6, beginning at 6:00 pm.

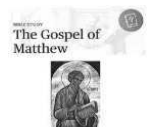

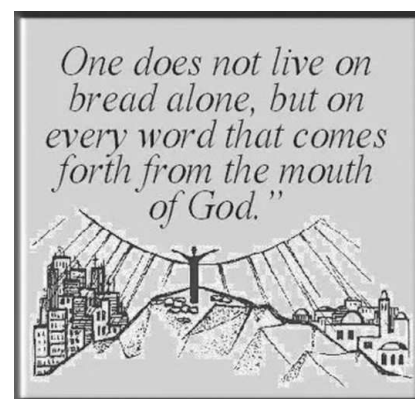
