A journey of Faith toward a greater holiness. Does this phrase sound familiar to you? My hope and prayer are that you have come to realize that this is the overarching theme for every Baptized person. When you received the sacrament of Baptism you were received into the Body of Christ, cleansed in the waters of regeneration and called to mission. Each of us is individually called by God to pursue this call to mission **with a thirst** for truth, goodness and beauty. Prior to the convening of the second Vatican council there was this misunderstanding that personnel holiness was something reserved for the ordained ministers of the church. But as you will read in the following paragraph from the dogmatic constitution of the church "Lumen Gentium" (the light of the nations), this was and is simply not the case. It is clear that the **UNIVERSAL CALL TO HOLINESS is for all the faithful and a key to living out that mission to go out.**

"(40) The Lord Jesus, the divine Teacher and Model of all perfection, preached holiness of life to each and every one of His disciples of every condition. He Himself stands as the author and consummator of this holiness of life: "Be you therefore perfect, even as your heavenly Father is perfect". Indeed, He sent the Holy Spirit upon **all men** that He might move them inwardly to love God with their whole heart and their whole soul, with all their mind and all their strength and that they might love each other as Christ loves them. **The followers of Christ are called by God,** not because of their works, but according to His own purpose and grace. They are justified in the Lord Jesus, because in the **baptism of faith they truly become sons of God** and sharers in the divine nature. **In this way they are really made holy. Then too, by God's gift, they must hold on to and complete in their lives this holiness they have received.** They are warned by the Apostle to **live "as to become saints"**, and to put on "as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved a heart of mercy, kindness, humility, meekness, patience", and to possess the fruit of the Spirit in holiness. Thus, it is evident to everyone, that all the faithful of Christ of whatever rank or status, are called to the fullness of the Christian life and to the perfection of charity; by this holiness as such a more human manner of living is promoted in this earthly society. In this way, the holiness of the People of God will grow into an abundant harvest of good, as is admirably shown by the life of so many saints in Church history." (LG 40-41)

Brothers and sisters in Christ, spiritual progress tends toward ever more intimate union with Christ, and as we journey toward this ever-closer union through our daily offering of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, let us be drawn more deeply into this call to holiness. May our Lenten mortifications and self-disciplines challenge each of us to let go of the things that keep us from growing in holiness. May we recognize in these disciplines a greater share in the cross and conversely a greater share in the resurrection.

May your Lenten journey continue with an abundance of Grace, peace and holiness.

Religious Education “News You Need to Know”

Eucharistic Miracles — Each week during Lent, the Knights of Columbus are placing a display of Eucharistic Miracles in each church. These miracles help us to understand and believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the body and blood at Holy Communion. It is said that over 40% of Catholics no longer believe in the Real Presence. The Knights are placing a new display each week during Lent. Stop and look at the Miracles.

What is a Eucharistic Miracle

- **Definition:** These events occur after the moment of transubstantiation in the Mass, when the bread and wine become the body and blood of Christ.
- The most frequent occurrences involve a communion host turning into blood or visibly appearing as human flesh, often specifically heart tissue.
- **Scientific Investigation:** The Catholic Church investigates these claims thoroughly. Scientific testing on several, such as in Lanciano, Italy (8th century) and Legnica, Poland (2013), has identified the samples as human heart muscle in a state of distress.
- **Purpose:** These miracles are intended to reinforce belief in the Real Presence of Christ.
- **Famous Examples**
- Lanciano, Italy (c. 750): A monk doubting the Real Presence saw the host turn into flesh and the wine into blood, which coagulated into five globules.
- Buenos Aires, Argentina (1996): A desecrated host turned into blood-covered tissue; scientific analysis later found it to be human heart tissue.
- Legnica, Poland (2013): A host that fell to the ground was placed in water and developed red stains, which were confirmed to be human heart tissue.
- **Saint Carlo Acutis**, as a teenager, documented these occurrences of Eucharistic Miracles. The Medford KCs have 160 panels from the information gathered by Carlos Acutis.

40 Cans for 40 Days — The Knights of Columbus are collecting food items and cash donations during Lent to help people in need in Taylor County. Food items can be dropped off in the Four Parish Office at Holy Rosary. Donation boxes are located in all Four Parishes. Cash donations can be placed in an envelope with “**40 Cans for 40 Days**” written on the outside and dropped in the collection baskets. Cash donations can also be dropped off or mailed to the Holy Rosary office.

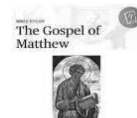
