The name "Lent" literally comes from the word meaning "springtime." This is so fitting for us because it invites us to recognize the new life that awaits us at Easter time. We remember that we are dust, and just as God formed life from the dust of the earth, we wait for that moment when He will bring new life to us in a spiritual springtime. Just as the soil itself needs nourishment, so do our hearts in order to bring forth new life. This is what Lent is all about: nourishing our hearts by drawing closer to Christ in order to be renewed.

We, as a Church, commit to two things that are mirrored in our Gospel readings throughout the season of Lent: we acknowledge that we have failed in our attempts to follow the Lord, and we confess our sins as we wait in constant preparation for our hearts to receive the glory of the resurrection. In this process of conversion, through humility, we are reminded that our life is passing away: "you were made from dust and to dust you shall return" (Gen. 3:19). But, from this dust, we will find new life in Him through the nourishment of our souls in prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. From the dust of the earth, much like a new seedling, new life will break forth from the surface of the ground.

One great means of nourishing our hearts during Lent is to pray with God's Word. In our desire to grow in prayer during this time, Pope Benedict XVI said: *"The diligent reading of Sacred Scripture accompanied by prayer brings about that intimate dialogue in which the person reading hears God who is speaking, and in praying, responds to him with trusting openness of heart. If it is effectively promoted, this practice will bring to the Church - I am convinced of it - a new spiritual springtime."* Sacred scripture is an incredible way to draw closer to Christ in prayer and to open our hearts to His words. If you are looking for a new way to grow in prayer during this season, I encourage you to take some time with scripture. God's word feeds the soul like nothing else, giving us direction, consolation, and encouragement.

My prayer for us this Lent is that we will take the time and effort to nourish our hearts in Christ this Lent, so that when Easter comes, our hearts will burst with life at Christ's resurrection.

What is 40 Hours Devotion:

It is a special exposition of the Blessed Sacrament over a period of three days, during which prayers continue uninterrupted for an approximate total of 40 hours.



The Forty Hours is similar to a parish renewal or retreat, but with more time for mental and personal prayer. It is a time to be alone in prayer with Jesus. but also for the community to come together for liturgical prayer. The number 40 and the period of three days is a remembrance of the 40 hours from Jesus' burial until His resurrection, but also a remembrance of the 40-day fast of Jesus in the desert. Our parish will be celebrating this devotion starting Thursday, March 19th at 4:00pm and going through Saturday, March 21st at 8:00am. There's a sign up sheet in the front entrance of Holy Rosay Parish. Please sign up for an hour.

Religious Education "News You Need to Know"

Confirmation Retreat is next weekend. The retreat is Saturday & Sunday, March 21 & 22. The retreat starts at 1:00pm. Please be on time. Arrive early to get signed in. This retreat is for students from all four of our parishes. Please sign up for the retreat as we need to plan the correct amount of food for the Saturday dinner and Sunday breakfast. Students MUST attend a retreat to be confirmed. If you do not attend the retreat here in Medford, it is your responsibility to attend a retreat before October 1, 2026.

Youth Group event today — Today from 3:00pm to 5:00pm there is a Youth Group event to be held at Holy Rosary. The event is called "Can You Solve the Mystery". This is a live-action Clue game. What is Lent for? Lent is a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. Through the three pillars of Lent, we journey to develop a closer relationship with God. The 40 days of Lent should be filled with reflection, service, and prayer.

As we begin our Lenten journey, we need to ask ourselves how we will prepare. Here are some Lenten suggestions:

- Set up a daily time each day to pray.
- Go to Confession during Lent.
- Make a commitment to attend Mass every week.
- Donate or help people in need.

Check the bulletin for Reconciliation times at all four parishes.

Holy Rosary School News

Vision Statement — Holy Rosary Catholic School will be the school of choice for all families of Holy Rosary Parish, as well as, for other families who desire a quality Catholic education that will ensure students begin their life's journey with a strong foundation of faith and knowledge.

Each Student Matters, Every Moment Counts, Christ in the Center

Holy Rosary students in grades 3-6 began a new reading curriculum this school year called "Read Side by Side."

This program attends to students' volume of reading by using full length chapter books and longer nonfiction to increase students' confidence and competence.

Our staff loves the choice of novels and the integration of reading and writing. The final part is the book club share outs. This is where students use stem questions to encourage their classmates to go deeper into the reading experience and connect it to their own lives.



The fifth graders are learning about hearing and sound in science class. They are studying the parts of the ear and how sound is caused by vibrations traveling through solids, liquids, and gasses. As they near the end of the unit, they are making a model of one of the greatest inventions related

to sound - the phonograph. The phonograph was invented in 1877 by Thomas Edison. It allowed sound to be recorded and played back later. Hopefully, when the students finish their models of the phonograph, we'll have some recordings to share. We would like to thank Mr. Johaneck for donating the kits to the science class.

Fifth and Sixth grade students had the opportunity to participate in an after school Sewing Club. Thank you Mrs. Gelhaus for volunteering to do this!

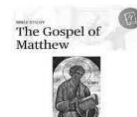
