Father Patrick

As we approach the final days of Lent, the Gospel for the Fifth Sunday of Lent (Year A) presents the powerful account of the raising of Lazarus (John 11:1-45). Standing before the tomb of His friend, Jesus proclaims, "I am the resurrection and the life." What seemed to be the end becomes the moment when God's life-giving power is revealed. This Gospel reminds us that Christ does not stand far away from our suffering, sin, or death. Instead, He enters into those dark places and calls us out, just as He called Lazarus by name. The Lord desires not only to forgive us but to restore us to life.

One of the most concrete ways Christ calls us out of the tomb is through the Sacrament of Confession. During Lent, the Church urges us to examine our hearts and bring our sins before God's mercy. Like the stone that was rolled away from Lazarus' tomb, the burdens we carry are lifted when we honestly confess them before the Lord. In the confessional, we encounter Christ Himself, who frees us from what binds us and restores us to grace. The words of absolution are not simply a ritual; they are the voice of the risen Lord calling us back to life.

As Pope Leo XIV once reflected, "The confessional is a place where the tomb is opened, and the Christian is called again into life." Lent is a privileged time to respond to that call. I encourage each of us to make use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation before Easter. Just as Lazarus stepped out of the darkness into the light, may we also come forward—freed, forgiven, and renewed—ready to celebrate the victory of Christ's Resurrection.

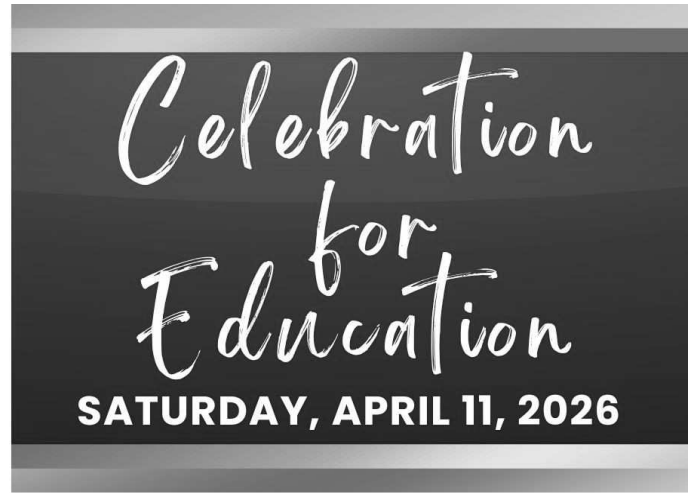
