HOLY WEEK

Welcome to the BIG DANCE! No, I'm not talking about the men's NCAA final four. I'm talking about **the week that changes everything**. A week so solemn, so sacred, they gave it a name unlike any other. HOLY WEEK. I'm

sure by now, you've got your picks in. You have consulted with family and friends and you all agree that Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday are at the top of the list for first round appearances. This "HOLY" week is historically different from any other and guess what??? You and your family and friends get a front row seat. Yes, like most Catholic churches on any given Sunday, the front seats are usually wide open. I'm not sure why, because what happens here is literally WORLDS apart from any other event in the history of the world. Now that I have your attention, all kidding aside. Have you planned for a truly life changing week? I know this may sound a little theatrical, but really. More people have come to know Christ during Holy Week than is given credit.

Please consider and pray for all the new members who have spent countless hours in OCIA (order of Christian initiation of adults) preparing to come into the church. The USCCB reported that the national trend saw some 37,000 new members annually and these new members include both catechumens (unbaptized) and candidates (already baptized in another Christian tradition). Why is this such a big deal? Is there some great prize to be had? YES and YES. Why is coming home to the Catholic Church such a big deal? The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) teaches that the Church is **necessary for salvation**, acting as the "universal sacrament of salvation" and the Body of Christ through which all salvation flows (CCC 777, 846-847). Founded by Jesus, it is the visible means, "sign and instrument" of divine grace, gathering humanity together. **The means of Salvation and the prize is Heaven.**

Now that we have touched on the importance of the Church, let's get back to the greatest week in history and the means to an end. Yes, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday are the four major trump cards of the week but they don't call it a week for just no reason. How many of the players in the NCAA show up to the big dance without any practice??? None...what a disaster that would be. They do things to get ready to participate so they can be fully engaged! Well, the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week are important days just as are the days leading up to the big dance.

I encourage each of us to set aside some time to listen to the Lord. Spend time reading and meditating on the MANY readings that will be proclaimed over the course of the week. Take in some Adoration time in front of the Blessed Sacrament and go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Offer your fast and abstinence for the lost and lonely, the separated and forgotten. My dear friends in Christ as the mystical body we are called to a full, active, conscious, participation. Let us make this week truly...HOLY!

Religious Education “News You Need to Know”

Holy Week is here! Holy Week is the most important week in Catholicism. This week of great reverence and reflection spans the final eight days of Jesus’ life—from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday. Here is just a sample of what happens during Holy Week.

Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus's triumphal entry into Jerusalem, where he was greeted by a cheering crowd waving palm branches, marking the start of Holy Week and the events leading to his crucifixion and resurrection.

Holy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper, when Jesus consecrated bread and wine. The washing of the feet takes place during the Mass of the Lord’s Supper in the evening.

Good Friday is one of the darkest days of the year for Catholics. It covers Jesus’ arrest, trial, and crucifixion. His death and burial are also memorialized. Good Friday is a day of fasting within the Church. Traditionally, there is no Mass and no celebration of the Eucharist on Good Friday. Communion comes from hosts consecrated on Holy Thursday. Church bells are silent. Altars are left bare. The solemn, muted atmosphere is preserved until the Easter Vigil.

Holy Saturday remembers the day that Jesus spent in the grave. The Easter Vigil takes place at the end of the day at 8:30pm. The vigil begins at sunset on Holy Saturday outside the church, where an Easter fire is kindled, and the Paschal candle is blessed and then lit. After the conclusion of the Liturgy of the Word, the water of the baptismal font is solemnly blessed, and any catechumens and candidates who enter into full communion are initiated into the church.

Please check the bulletin for the Holy Week schedule and time of the services. These services are some of the best and most moving services of the year. Please try to attend as many Holy Week services as possible.

Each Student Matters, Every Moment Counts, Christ in the Center

March is the month of reading and here is a little background about our programs here at Holy Rosary School. Holy Rosary School prides itself on helping our children become successful readers.

SuperKids PK-2 literacy program, is aligned with the science of reading, and has a free, faith-based component! Our new Read-Side-by-Side 3-6 program also has a faith-based component. The children are doing well with both of these literacy programs. Aligned with the science of reading as well as featuring relatable characters that help students learn how to be respectful and responsible, **SuperKids** reading curriculum does all that! Last year we were able to update our Kindergarten class with the newest edition and next year will be time for grade 1 with grade 2 being updated the following year.

Our **Read-Side-by-Side** program is ‘real’ books in the hands of all students, not just excerpts from stories in a reader. The ability to read books together and dive deep into characters make this program beloved by students and teachers! This program helps to increase students’ confidence, stamina and competence. This program encourages book talks and helps children dive deep into their reading experience. **The mission of Read-Side-by-Side is to prepare all students for life-long reading by providing quality, evidence-based curriculum to engage all students.**

We feel very fortunate to have these updated, science of reading, based programs available for our students. We also have had our Accelerated Reading Program for many years. This is a supplemental reading program that supports guided independent reading practice. It is popular with the students as they can read choice books on their level and then receive quick and accurate assessments. In the month of February our students read 691 books which was 3,393,666 words with an average of 45 minutes a day for an individual.

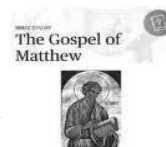

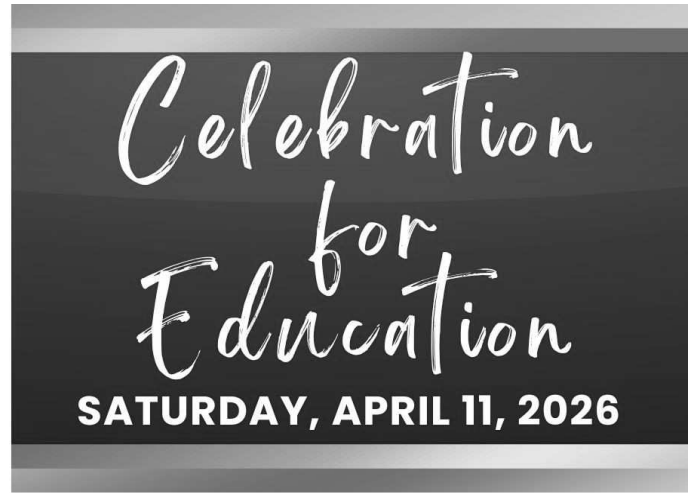
