Father Patrick

As we continue through the Easter season, the Sixth Sunday of Easter (Year A) gives us that deeply reassuring promise from the Lord: *"I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you."* Christ remains with His people—and one of the most beautiful ways He does that is through the sacraments, especially the Sacrament of Marriage.

Marriage is not simply a human arrangement or a private commitment. For the baptized, it is a sacrament—a real encounter with Christ, who unites a man and a woman in a covenant that reflects His own faithful, life-giving love for the Church. In marriage, Christ promises to remain with the couple, to strengthen them, and to make their love a visible sign of His presence in the world.

This is why the Church places such importance on being married in the Church. For Catholics, this is not just a preference or tradition—it is a requirement. Marriage has been entrusted to the Church by Christ, and so Catholics are called to enter into it according to the form the Church has established—before a priest or deacon and two witnesses. This ensures that the marriage is not only valid, but that it truly becomes a sacrament, open to the grace God desires to give. It's not about rules for their own sake, but about receiving the fullness of what Christ offers.

The Church speaks clearly about this responsibility. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches: *"The matrimonial covenant... has been raised by Christ the Lord to the dignity of a sacrament between the baptized"* (CCC 1601). Because of this, the Church also requires that Catholics celebrate marriage according to ecclesial form so that this sacramental reality is truly present and recognized.

In the months ahead, we are blessed to celebrate a number of weddings across our One Family Catholic Community. This is a real sign of hope and life among us. Each of these couples is stepping forward in faith, inviting Christ into their marriage from the very beginning. As a community, we should keep them in our prayers—that their love may be strong, faithful, and rooted in Christ.

At the same time, this is also an invitation for all of us to reflect on our own marriages. For those who are married in the Church, this is an opportunity to renew that grace—to turn again to the Lord and ask Him to strengthen the promises you have made. And for those who, for whatever reason, were not married in the Church, know that the door is always open. Having a marriage blessed—what we call convalidation—is not simply a formality, but a true moment of grace. As the Church's law expresses it: *"A marriage which is invalid because of defect of form must be convalidated"* (Code of Canon Law, can. 1160). In other words, the Church desires to help couples bring their marriage into the fullness of sacramental life.

Jesus tells us in the Gospel, *"If you love me, you will keep my commandments."* Living marriage according to God's plan is one of those ways we show our love—not just in words, but in the concrete reality of our lives. And we do not do this alone. The Holy Spirit has been given to us to guide, strengthen, and sustain us.

We are not abandoned. Christ is with us—especially in the sacraments. May we be open to His presence, and may our families and marriages be places where His love is clearly seen and lived.

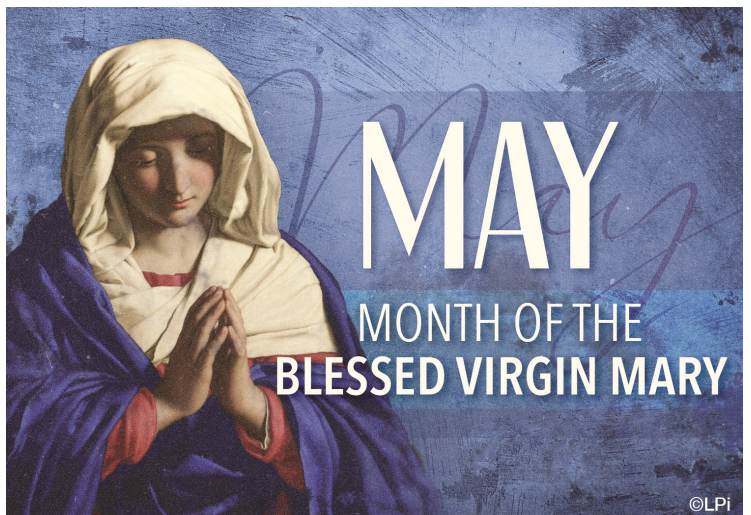
