A NOTE FROM FR. PATRICK

"Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing." (Luke 10:41-42)

In this Sunday's Gospel, Martha is busy serving while Mary chooses to sit at the feet of Jesus and listen to Him. Martha's work was good, but Jesus gently reminds her that the most important thing is to remain close to Him. When we place Christ first, He teaches us how to love as He loves.

This week, the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates Natural Family Planning (NFP) Awareness Week, an opportunity to reflect on God's beautiful plan for marriage and family life.

In a world that often views fertility as something to be controlled or suppressed, the Church proclaims a different vision—one that recognizes fertility as a gift from God and an essential part of the married vocation.

Natural Family Planning is more than a method of family planning. It is a way of living married love that respects God's design for the human person. By understanding the natural signs of fertility, married couples can responsibly discern the timing of pregnancies while honoring both the unitive and procreative dimensions of marriage. NFP encourages communication, mutual sacrifice, respect, and trust in God's providence.

The Church's teaching on marriage and human life is rooted not in rules for their own sake, but in the truth that authentic love always seeks the good of the other. As Pope St. John Paul II wrote, "The future of humanity passes by way of the family." Strong marriages build strong families, and strong families build strong parishes and communities.

Whether you are newly married, preparing for marriage, raising children, or simply seeking to better understand the Church's teaching, I encourage you to learn more about Natural Family Planning. Even those who are not married can benefit from understanding the beauty of God's design for human love and the dignity of every person.

As we celebrate NFP Awareness Week, let us pray for all married couples—that they may grow in holiness, deepen their love for one another, remain open to God's will, and become joyful witnesses to the Gospel of Life.

"Jesus, help us always choose the one thing necessary: to remain close to You, so that every vocation, every marriage, and every family may reflect Your faithful and life-giving love."

Do What Needs to Be Done

A friend recently confided in me that although he prayed frequently each day and was involved heavily in his parish, he did not sense much fruit coming from it all and was left feeling unsatisfied. I assured him he was not alone. I told him of a deceased pastor of mine who had spoken frequently about being in this type of situation. Even as a priest, he knew all too well of how we can feel like we are simply going through the motions. It is precisely at those times that continuing to pray and practicing good stewardship is most important, because it would be easier to simply take a break and risk never coming back. He liked to say, "Do the drill," meaning just do what needs to be done.

We are all called to be mature disciples who answer the call of Jesus Christ regardless of the cost. We cannot choose when and where the call will come. We cannot schedule our stewardship in a way that is always most convenient for us. Even when the fruits of our faithful efforts seem hidden from us, we hold to the promise that we are never called to give of ourselves for nothing. God is working through us and in us. No matter how dry the land may seem, seeds are being planted to yield a harvest greater than we can ever realize. Stay strong and do the drill!

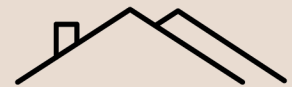
