A NOTE FROM FR. PATRICK

In this Sunday's Gospel (Matthew 13:44-52), Jesus tells three short parables about the Kingdom of Heaven. A man finds a treasure hidden in a field. A merchant discovers a pearl of great price. In both stories, they joyfully sell everything they own in order to gain something infinitely more valuable.

One small word is easy to overlook: joyfully.

The man does not reluctantly give up his possessions. The merchant does not complain about what he is sacrificing. Their hearts have been captured by something so beautiful, so valuable, that everything else pales in comparison.

This is the heart of Christian discipleship.

Our world often sees sacrifice as a burden or a loss. We naturally ask, "What do I have to give up?" But Jesus invites us to ask a different question: "What have I found that is worth everything?"

Every vocation involves sacrifice. Married couples sacrifice for one another and for their children. Parents lose sleep, give up personal time, and place their family's needs before their own. Priests sacrifice the gift of marriage to devote themselves entirely to Christ and His Church. Religious men and women embrace lives of poverty, chastity, and obedience. Every disciple is called to sacrifice comfort, selfishness, and sin.

Yet authentic Christian sacrifice is never meant to be joyless. We do not sacrifice because God wants to make life difficult. We sacrifice because we have discovered Someone greater than anything we leave behind. We have found Jesus Christ—the true Treasure and Pearl of Great Price.

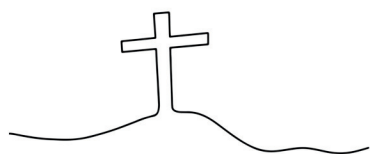
St. John Paul II beautifully reminded us:

"It is Jesus in fact that you seek when you dream of happiness; He is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you."
(World Youth Day Vigil, 2000)

When we encounter Christ, our sacrifices become acts of love rather than obligations. They are transformed from losses into investments in eternal life.

As members of our *One Family Catholic Community*, may we continually ask the Lord to deepen our love for Him. The more we know Christ, the more joyful our sacrifices become. We begin to realize that we are not giving up everything for God—we are receiving everything in Him.

May we have the courage to let go of whatever keeps us from fully following Christ and discover, with joy, that the Kingdom of Heaven is worth every sacrifice.

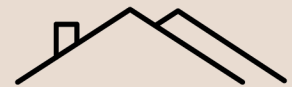

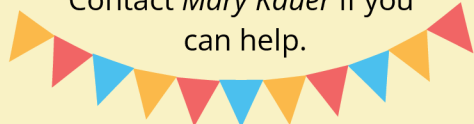
