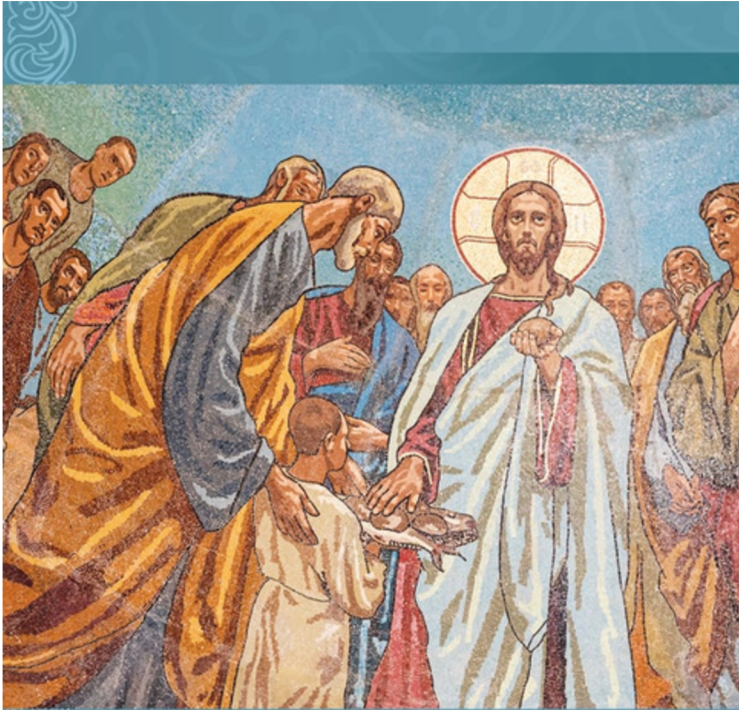

A NOTE FROM DEACON PAT

Abundance

As I drive the seventy miles to and from the office each day, I am surrounded by signs of God's abundance. Fields stretch for miles, filled with corn, soybeans, and other crops nearing harvest. Along the roads, gardens overflow with tomatoes, beans, squash, and colorful flowers. It is impossible not to notice the beauty of creation and the blessings that come from the hard work of those who plant, cultivate, and trust that God will provide the growth. The Early Church Fathers often taught that creation itself is a testimony to God's abundant goodness. Every field, every garden, every harvest is an invitation to recognize the generosity of the Creator and to respond with gratitude and faith.

That same message echoes throughout today's Scriptures. Through the prophet Isaiah, God extends an invitation that seems almost unbelievable: "Come, all you who are thirsty... come, eat... without money and without cost." In a world where everything seems to have a price, God's greatest gifts—His mercy, grace, and salvation—are freely given. The Lord invites us to stop chasing what can never satisfy and instead receive the nourishment that only He can provide.

The Gospel deepens this lesson in a remarkable way. Faced with thousands of hungry people, the disciples see only scarcity. Five loaves and two fish appear hopelessly inadequate. Their eyes are fixed on what they lack. Jesus, however, sees the same situation through the eyes of divine abundance. He takes the small offering, blesses it, breaks it, and gives it away. What seemed insufficient becomes more than enough. Everyone eats, everyone is satisfied, and baskets of food remain.

How often do we approach life like the disciples? We focus on our limitations—our time, our abilities, our resources—and conclude that we have too little to offer. Yet Christ asks only that we place our small gifts into His hands. He delights in multiplying what is offered with faith, revealing that His generosity far exceeds our expectations.

The miracle of the loaves foreshadows the Eucharist, where Christ continues to feed His people with the Bread of Life. There we discover that our deepest hunger is not for material things but for communion with God. As St. Paul reminds us, nothing—not hardship, hunger, suffering, nor any trial—can separate us from the love of Christ.

The abundance I witness each day along the roadside is more than a sign of a successful growing season. It is a living reminder that creation continually proclaims the goodness of God. As the Fathers of the Church recognized, the natural world invites us to see beyond the gifts themselves to the Giver. May we respond with grateful hearts, trusting that the God who fills the fields, feeds the multitude, and nourishes us in the Eucharist will never cease to provide all that we truly need.

May the abundance of God's Grace and Goodness be multiplied in you this week

The Power of a Simple Action

I remember seeing a story on a morning news program about a little girl who wanted to give an elderly man in a grocery store a hug. She had no way of knowing that this man had just lost his wife of many years and now felt so very alone and depressed. Her reaching out to the man seemed odd to her mom at first, but the girl was so insistent about giving a hug she moved the shopping carts close together so the exchange could take place.

No one knew that from that moment on the little girl would ask to visit her new friend at least once a week for the next four years until he passed away. In an interview soon after the initial encounter, the man said, "I haven't been this happy in some time." Imagine the joy that relationship brought to them both over the years!

It was just a moment. It was a simple gesture. Yet, it had a large impact that no one could have predicted. You never know what will result when we give just a little of ourselves. That uncertainty too often leads us to hold back or refrain from the simple actions of love or gestures of generosity that could come so easily for us if we wanted. We should never doubt the power of a simple random act of kindness. Generosity does not need to be grand to make a big difference. The time is now, and the opportunity presents itself often to plant a small seed that God can water and nourish so that something beautiful can grow.
