A NOTE FROM FATHER PATRICK

This proclamation from our Lord is a profound statement about His mission and the establishment of the Pope and hierarchy of the Church. As we hear in the Gospel for this, the 21 Sunday in Ordinary Time, the responsibility that Christ places upon the human leadership of His Church is great. Christ entrusts His Church—His Body and the presence of the Kingdom of Heaven on earth—to broken, imperfect, and even sinful human leaders. As difficult as this may seem, the trust and confidence that Christ places in Peter, and in turn in all the human leaders of His Church, is a profound testimony of His love and His desire to work through us.

I have to admit that when I reflect on what God entrusts to human hearts, including my own, it can be quite daunting. However, one of the hopeful facts of our Gospel is that Peter was not the only one there when Christ entrusted him with the Church. The leadership of the Church was never meant to be a solo mission. From the very beginning, Christ surrounded Peter with the other Apostles, forming a fraternity of men who would encourage, challenge, support, and strengthen one another in the mission He had given them. There is a fraternity, a brotherhood, that God has formed to build up and support the broken men whom He calls to lead and serve His Church. I thank God for this profound gift of fraternity, which especially exists in the Diocese of Superior.

This past week has been a beautiful reminder of that gift. We had the joy of welcoming seminarians from throughout our diocese here in the One Family Catholic Community for a time of gathering and fraternity. It is important that our seminarians experience and develop this brotherhood even while they are in formation. They are not simply preparing to become individual priests; they are preparing to become brothers in a presbyterate, and co-workers in the vineyard of Christ. The friendships, trust, prayer, and mutual support that they develop now can become a source of strength for them for many years of priestly ministry.

We were also blessed this past Sunday and Monday to gather with priests of our diocese who were ordained between 2012 and 2023. It is a pretty special thing to see priests from different parishes, backgrounds, and experiences come together simply as brothers.

The fraternity that exists among the priests of the Diocese of Superior is something that I do not take for granted. It is a gift that strengthens us in our ministry and reminds us that none of us carries the responsibility of priesthood alone.

I am especially grateful for the support and encouragement that you, the members of the One Family Catholic Community, give to fostering this fraternity. Your willingness to welcome seminarians, support vocations, and encourage your priests is an investment not only in the priests and seminarians of today, but in the future of the Church throughout our diocese.

The strength of this brotherhood will have a direct impact on the strength of our parishes and our ability to proclaim the Gospel for generations to come. The Lord entrusted His Church to human beings, but He never intended us to carry that responsibility alone. Just as Peter needed the other Apostles, we need one another. May we continue to pray that our seminarians grow not only in holiness and knowledge, but also in genuine brotherhood; and may we priests continue to strengthen one another in the joy and sacrifice of our vocation. In doing so, we help ensure that the Church in the Diocese of Superior will continue to be built upon the rock that is Christ and faithfully carry His mission into the future.
